





If you wish to appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board, a copy of an appeal form is available from the Ontario Municipal Board website at www.omb.gov.on.ca or from the Clerk of the Township of King. Please note the Board will only accept filing fee payments by certified cheque or money order.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a byaw to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the by-law was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of King passed By-law Number 2013-85 on the 8th day nder Section 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.C Chapter P.13. By-law number 2013-85 amends Zoning By-law 74-53, as amended.

The intent of the zoning amendment application is to facilitate the creation of a new lot for conservation purposes whereby a 28.7 nectare (71 acre) parcel would be severed and conveyed to the Nature Conservancy of Canada while a 3.2 hectare (8 acre) parcel would be retained for continued residential purposes. The amendment seeks to sterilize the severed lands for building purposes by restricting the range of permitted uses that are consisent with natural heritage conservation purposes. The amendment also addresses a reduction in the minimum lot frontage for the severed lands while reductions in both the lot frontage minimum and lot area minimum are requested for the retained lands


