King has plenty to be thankful for: 2021 marked many milestones

As we wind down the year 2021, it is a breath of fresh air to safely return to in-person activities despite the continuing battle against

Standing outside of the bright, beautiful new King City branch of the King Public Library and the King City Seniors' Centre in November, it was exciting to see dozens of people - celebrating the long-awaited opening of the facility.

The return to safe, in-person holiday events is meaningful for so many.

The annual Nobleton Tree Lighting returned in December, bringing holiday spirit that included local food and carols. Santa's Christmas Cruise, presented in partnership with King Fire and Emergency Services, the Schomberg Firefighters Association and York Regional Police, made its way throughout King Township neighbourhoods the first weekend in December. A Main Street Christmas Parades drive-through

event also brightened Schomberg in 2021.

Township Vaccine Clinic

From April to July, King held a mass, community-led COVID-19 vaccination clinic for Township residents at the Trisan Centre in Schomberg. More than 75,000 doses were administered over four months.

The vaccine clinic, led by King Fire and Emergency Services, was made possible with the help of York Region, more than 250 volunteers, 30 Township staff, 15 firefighters, medical personnel and more than 40 sponsors.

Pop-Up Patios

When restaurants were able to offer outdoor dining in June, King Township offered its support with an expanded Pop-Up Patio program on Main Street in Schomberg. The program grew to four pop-up patios in 2021 following the success of the program in 2020.

Community Improvement Plan

King rolled out the Community Improvement Plan (CIP) Grant Program, receiving 13 CIP Applications and awarding more than \$62,000 in 2021.

The Township continued to promote local shopping through the #shopKING marketing program in collaboration with the King Chamber of Commerce and local media. Check out local goods and services at www.kingchamber.

Zero per cent Tax Increases

Recognizing that many are struggling with the financial impacts of the pandemic, the Township approved the 2021 Budget in January 2021 and the 2022 Budget in November 2021, both with a zero-per-cent impact on the Township's portion of the tax base.

EV Charging Stations

In early December, the Province announced that the King City ONRoute is among the province's highway rest stops chosen to have electric vehicle (EV) charging capability.

In addition, the Township is installing up to a dozen EV charging stations throughout King starting this year after receiving a grant of \$200,000 in 2021 from the federal government. King will contribute \$300,000.



King is geared up and ready to tackle the snow and ice this winter. Our winter maintenance crews are responsible for clearing over 320 kilometres of roads. The Township's fleet includes two graders, 12 plows-

King will remove snow from roads when severe accumulations affect twoway traffic and the ability for on-street parking. This may take several days after accumulations occur and is performed on a priority basis.

complete with sand and salt units—and three contracted sidewalk plows.

First priority is given to commercial areas and areas where safety is a concern.

Residents are reminded to avoid parking on the street so that snowplowing and snow removal crews can operate effectively.

Some snowstorms last many hours or have initial freezing rain that turns into snow. In these conditions, a re-plowing of priority streets may be required to maintain traffic safety. Re-plowing may occur before road crews can move on to other local streets. The priority of snow clearing is based on Minimum Maintenance Standards Regulations

Class of Road	Total Snow Accumulation	Time to Clear
Arterial Roads	8 cm	12 hours
Collector	8 cm	16 hours
Local	10 cm	24 hours

Due to varied shapes, sizes and presence of centre islands, cul-de-sacs require specialized snow removal equipment and procedures. The Township road system currently contains many cul-de-sacs and we understand the frustration that can occur for affected residents.

Most routes are completed with a 12-hour period. Clearance times may be longer when snowfall is exceptionally heavy, there are complications due to freezing rain, many cars are parked on the street or crews are working during peak traffic times. In accordance with Ministry of Labour Regulations, drivers cannot work more than 13 hours without a rest period. This can impact snow clearance time.

Climate Action

King completed the draft of its First Climate Change Plan. It goes to Council for approval in the first quarter of 2022. The Township also led sustainability workshops and partnership-based tree plantings.

In-Person Service

As part of a cautious approach to maintaining public and staff safety during the COVID-19 pandemic, King continued to gradually reopen in-person services, including at the King Township Municipal Centre. King's Website

Road Safety in King

King also began the first year of 10-year plan to resurface a number of paved roads and upgrade the existing surface-treated and gravel roads to a pavement

Federal and Provincial Grants







Province acting on key recommendations to create a better future for workers and their families

he Ontario government is releasing 21 recommendations from the Ontario Workforce Recovery Advisory Committee (OWRAC) on making the province the best place to live, work and raise a family.

The committee delivered their interim report in the summer, which has led to the passing of first-of-their-kind changes in Canada through the Working for Workers Act, 2021, including requiring most workplaces to have a right to disconnect policy, banning businesses from using non-compete agreements, and making it easier for internationally-trained individuals to practice in their professions.

"The future of work is already here. If we want to be leaders, we need to quickly adapt," said Monte McNaughton, Minister of Labour, Training and Skills Development. "We're not going back to where we were before the pandemic. Taking these steps now rebalances the scales and puts Ontario workers and their families first for generations to come."

To better understand the challenges associated with the changing nature of work, the committee consulted extensively with workers, labour groups, businesses, and academics across Ontario and internationally.

"Workers are the subject matter experts of their own experiences, and this report would not have been possible without these sage perspectives," said Rohinton P. Medhora, OWRAC chair and president of the Centre for International Governance Innovation. "It was a privilege to hear directly from over 700

Ontarians as our committee worked to identify practical solutions that will provide tangible improvements to the lives of workers in this province. With this report, I'm confident we've done just that."

Recommendations from the committee include:

#8: "Appoint an expert to design and test a portable benefits program, where contributors could be employers, workers and the government."

#15: "Create and recognize the dependent contractor category for gig or platform workers in the app-based space and give this category of workers basic employment rights."

"The future of work is already here. If ewant to be leaders, we need to quickadapt," said Monte McNaughton, inister of Labour, Training and Skills #21: Develop an employment brand and communications strategy for domestic and international markets to promote Ontario as a desirable place to work and live.

The government is considering all of the report's recommendations and plans to take further action, including steps to protect and support digital platform workers. Already, Ontario is improving transportation, virtual care, and broadband internet access to become a "work from anywhere" province.

From June to September, the Committee met with over 150 workers, union leaders, advocacy groups, and employers. They reviewed and analyzed an additional 550 written submissions, and surveyed over 2,000 people from Ontario.

The OWRAC members included experts from a variety of sectors and professions, including labour law, governance, academia and venture capital.



Support for workers and employers will continue until July 31, 2022

he Ontario government is extending its Worker Income Protection Benefit program, which provides paid sick days, until July 31, 2022 to continue keeping workers safe and ensure they do not lose pay if they need to miss work for reasons related to COVID-19.

Employees can continue to access this paid leave to get tested, vaccinated, self-isolate, or care for a family member. Should the Canada Recovery Sickness Benefit be extended, workers in Ontario have access to the most generous paid sick days program in Canada.

"Nearly a quarter-million workers have already used our program, which is the first and most comprehensive in the country, for paid time off work," said Monte McNaughton, Minister of Labour, Training and Skills Development. "Our government is working for workers and ensuring they have the support they need to keep themselves and their families safe."

Extending the COVID-19 paid leave program will help more workers take time off to get their booster shots and help more parents take time to get their children vaccinated. To date, the program has helped over 235,000 people stay safe without worrying about losing pay. The average number of days being claimed per employee is two. To support employers, Ontario will continue reimbursing them for providing this support to their workers.

In addition, the province is taking action to

protect jobs and businesses by extending temporary changes to the Employment Standards Act that prevent temporary layoffs of non-unionized employees from becoming unwanted terminations, which can trigger payments and force businesses to close. This measure will now be extended until July 30, 2022.

These efforts build on Ontario's actions to support workers and businesses as we build the foundation for Ontario's economic strength and protect our progress against the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ontario first introduced paid COVID-19 days in April 2021 as part of the COVID-19 Putting Workers First Act, 2021.

With the extension of the program until July 31, 2022, employers will have 120 days after their employees are paid to submit their application to the Worker Income Protection Benefit

Over 515,000 paid leave days have been taken by employees since the entitlement was in-

Employers and workers can call the program's dedicated hotline at 1-888-999-2248 or visit Ontario.ca/COVIDworkerbenefit to get more information and updates about Ontario's paid sick days.

Extending paid COVID-19 days aligns with the government's plan, "A Plan to Safely Reopen Ontario and Manage COVID-19 for the Long-Term", developed in consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health.





May the year ahead bring you good health and happiness.




