# King Township 'hero' donates bone marrow

A hero can be the one who scores the game-winning goal, hits a walk off home run in the bottom of the ninth inning or maybe heroes are only meant to be found on the pages of comic books.

In the case of 10-year-old Landon Henry from Regina, King resident Jason Watt is the image of a true hero.

The two met for the first

time recently since Watt donated a rather large amount of bone marrow that saved Landon's life nearly three years ago.

"It is really good to come and meet them," said a smiling Landon. "Meeting Jason and his family is awesome."

"It was pretty exciting, that's for sure," Landon's dad Craig quickly added. "We've spent so much time going back and forth with

him and his family and we've known for quite a while now that we were going to come out and visit, but just to finally get here and meet them is just amazing. Hard time getting to sleep last night."

In July 2010, Landon was diagnosed with severe aplastic anemia, a rare condition which prevents bone marrow from being able to do its usual job of replenishing and creating

new blood cells.

"What they figured was that this virus shut down all his bone marrow - his blood producing system," said Landon's mom, Tammy. "One of the doctors in Regina said he sees one case of this every three years. Years ago, they said it would have been fatal."

At first doctors weren't quite sure what he had, but as time went on, it was clear that Landon was going to need a bone marrow transplant as other treatments weren't working. In August 2010, the search for a donor was on.

"They tested his brothers first (Kellen, 15, and Reece 13) and found that they weren't matches," Tammy said. "There was only a 25 per cent chance either brother would match - but Jason was perfect. He matched better than Landon's own brothers. He was a 10 out of 10 for a match."

At the time, Watt had already been on the registry for several years after signing up in 1998 when his friend Carol Olsen was diagnosed with leukemia and needed a bone marrow transplant.

Watt credited Jeff and Carol Olsen's foundation, "Friends for Life" for inspiring him into becoming a donor.

"I wouldn't have had the opportunity to save this guy's life, because I wouldn't have known anything about it," he said.

However, it wasn't until 12 years later that he would get the call telling him that he was a match for someone who was looking for a donor.

"In mid-September, I got a call on my cell phone at work from One Match saying that I was on the short list for someone who needed a transplant. Following a few blood tests I was the closest match and ended up having the donation procedure on Oct. 20, 2010.

"I had no fears at all," he continued. "When they

(One Match) first called me from Ottawa to say, 'we're looking for your bone marrow, because it's a match,' I wanted to hurry the process up to help them out even faster." And hurry they did. Just a few hours later, Landon was given the transfusion and on the road to recovery.

At that point, both Watt and the Henry family admitted it was tough having to wait a year to find out the identities of one another (as regulations dictate).

Landon, with the help of the hospital he was at, was able to get out a letter thanking his donor that would in no way give up his identity.

"Thank you so much for giving me your stem cells," the hand-written letter read. "They are working good. I feel great and I am out of the hospital now. My family is so happy."

Watt said that was all he needed to see until they were able to meet.

"That was a highlight for sure," he said.

After the procedure, it was a lengthy recovery for Landon. He missed Grade 2, had to stop having friends over and couldn't go out in public due to a severely weakened immune system.

Most of all, Landon said he missed playing sports during his recovery.

"When I was sick, I couldn't play sports, but now I can play hockey and football."

Watt said it is amazing to see him back playing sports and thriving.

"The kid now is winning championships, playing sports, leading his team in scoring in hockey," he said proudly.

Landon now plays hockey, football and ball hockey and said it feels good to be able to play again.

He now gets regular checkups, is doing great and his parents said he was incredible through a tough few years.

"He was really good. There was never any complaining or whining. He hated the IV though," Craig recalled.

When they were in Ontario visiting Watt, his wife Jenn and their family, the group certainly made the most of their time lounging poolside, visiting a cottage in Muskoka, traveling to Niagara Falls, a Blue Jays game and a visit to the Hockey Hall of Fame. All things Landon had a part in planning and couldn't wait to do.

"It's very exciting," said Tammy. "We've all been thinking about it for quite some time. Landon was very excited. He wasn't quite sure what he was going to say to Jason when he saw him, but they're just going to get to know one another. We've been talking about it for so long, so there's been the buildup and now were here."

Craig said Watt and his family have been incredible throughout the trip.

"We were standing outside the airport waiting for these people to come pick us up that we know, but have never met and all of a sudden this big motor home pulls up and what we've learned about Jason already, we shouldn't have been surprised," he said with a laugh. "It has been wonderful. They are terrific people."

"Great weather, great scenery and great times, but the people here are the real story," Craig continued. "Unbelievably friendly, fun-loving, welcoming and hospitable. We have really been embraced by everyone here, so we feel like honorary Ontarians."

Although just meeting in person for the first time, Landon himself put it best: "he helped give me a new life."

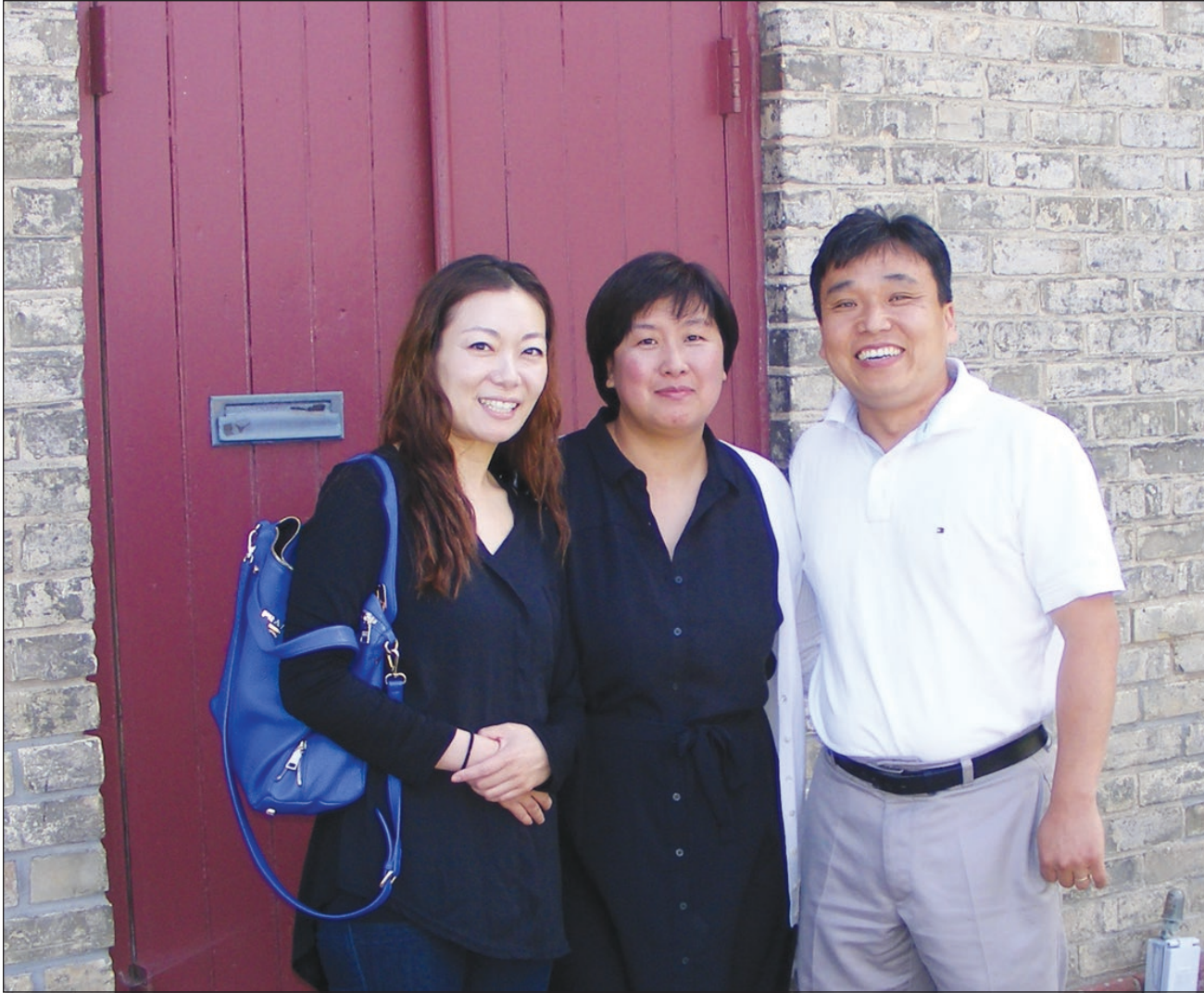

# Customer service is a key factor for consumers

In this very competitive world, I believe one key ingredient could make or break any company - customer service.

We've all heard horror stories and have likely battled it out with a customer service rep or two in our lives. I have witnessed irate customers at coffee shops, fast food restaurants and, drum roll please, almost every drive-thru.

Yes, we remember those bad experiences, but they quickly fade. We tend to remember the good ones, too.

These days nothing beats good manners, no matter the circumstances. There are many "grudge" purchases - car repairs, insurance premiums, interest charges, etc. While these situations don't put us in the best of moods, that doesn't mean we can't thank those on the other end. The employees who serve in those capacities have a tough job, why make it any tougher?

I always thank those in the fast food indus-

try - I know they spend long hours serving people and they deserve a thank you, or a "have a nice day." I imagine they get all kinds and are berated constantly. I feel for them.

I did brief stints as a dreaded telemarketer and went door to door for the last census and during the last municipal election campaign. I know all about "cold calling" and how people react when you just show up at their door, even though the cause is necessary.

According to a recent study by American Express, "great service beats kissing."

The scientific study commissioned by American Express revealed physiological, emotional and psychological impact of good service on the everyday lives of Canadians

Most of us feel good when we receive good service, and this world-first study actually revealed a correlation between great service experiences and improved health, proving that it really does pay (at least health-wise) to give and receive great service. Conducted across a global sample, the cognitive research study found that great

service can improve feelings of wellbeing, reduce feelings of anxiety and sadness, and even make people feel less lonely.

In fact, the study found that both providing and benefitting from great service triggers the same basic cerebral reactions as feeling loved, and that it positively affects our emotional state of mind.

Neurosense investigated the physiological and psychological effects great service has on customers. The study used highly specialized technology including, patented psychological testing and biometric testing to measure the impact of service on the mind and body.

"Our research shows great service experi-

ences rank as peak pleasures, which are known to decrease stress and improve feelings of wellbeing," said Professor Gemma Calvert, managing director of Neurosense Group. "The physiological, emotional and psychological effects of great service were recorded to have a positive impact on the body's overall wellbeing, which in turn has positive effect on the subject's health."

The American Express Service Study reveals:

- Great acts of service cause a chain reaction of positive responses in the body, increasing heart rate and galvanic skin response (or perspiration level) as excitement and exhilaration builds.

- 68 per cent of people felt their breathing rate decrease from 16.7 cycles per minute to 10.2 cycles per minute, as they relaxed and became happier when thinking about great service.

## Letters to the Editor Access should be reviewed

A resident from the 8th Concession wrote that the 8th Concession is not suitable and should never be considered an access route for the Slokker/Metrus development in Nobleton, and while on the surface of it, I would agree wholeheartedly; there are factors to be considered in view of the Metrusion/Slokker development.

The simple reality is that the traffic reports prepared for Slokker showed a traffic volume increase as a result of the Slokker development from 450 vehicle trips per day (pre-development) down Greenside Drive to an anticipated 4,500 vehicle trips per day down Greenside post-development. This does not factor in the Fandor (Stupp property) development or any of the other and multiple developments being considered and approved throughout Nobleton which will add to the logjams that will be the eventual end-result.

In due course, the demand will unquestionably exist for a secondary access and the Nobleton Community Plan sought to protect the 8th Concession; being the most logical and reasonable response to an eventual serious problem.

For my part, if I lived on the 8th I would be working very hard right now to create contingencies for when the Slokker/Metrus property is connected to the 8th. When I was on council I floated two possible suggestions, both theoretically designed to protect the majority of residents of the 8th Concession and the 15th Sideroad which quite simply involved dead-ending the 8th just south of the 15th; and allowing it to continue north from the 15th.

# One local example of green building design

## Sustainable King

Under the Environmental Pillar of King's Sustainability Plan, the most pressing theme is that of land use planning. "Supporting and encouraging green building design, development and construction" and "educating the public about the benefits of green development" are both important actions of the Plan.

So just how is the township doing in achieving these goals?

Let us examine one significant application with which council and staff have recently dealt. During the application process for the proposed LCBO outlet in Nobleton a number of controversial points were discussed at council. In the end these were resolved and residents can expect a new LCBO outlet to open in 2014 in the No Frills plaza on Highway 27.

Some of the discussions concerned the nature of the exterior lighting system. The attached photo shows how the Nobleton outlet will look and that the LED and fluorescent lights will be subdued and point downwards. This is an example of "Dark Sky Technology" that pre-

vents light pollution from spilling into neighbouring properties and the sky above.

The building will also have a number of other interesting energy conserving features. For example, light will be harvested from outside the outlet. Lights over the cash desks near the windows will have sensors that turn them off when natural light levels are sufficient to illuminate the area. Staff service area lights will be motion activated and thus only turned on when needed. Multiple lighting circuits will allow the staff to turn some circuits off during periods of high-energy use such as heat waves and after hours stocking.

Automated controls will monitor and reduce energy consumption of the heating, refrigeration, ventilation and air conditioning systems.

Do you know how new LCBO beer cold rooms are kept cold? Once the outside temperature goes below 10 degrees Celsius, the outside air is used to help cool the room! Makes a lot of sense, doesn't it?

The exterior brick is made by Hanson and is locally manufactured in Burlington. LEED provides a point for building products manufactured



within an 800-kilometre radius from the project site (by truck). Additionally, masonry is recognized as environmentally friendly as it is less prone to waste and easily recycled and reused as crushed fill. Brick provides thermal regulating to reduce the building's heating and cooling costs.

Low flow toilets will conserve water. The wood will all be certified by the Forest Stewardship Council that promotes responsible management of the world's forests. No toxic

chemicals will be allowed in the paints, glues or fabrics and the insulation in the walls will be R35 even though the building code requires only R20. The roof will include reflective ballast material that will reflect heat from the sun.

You may well ask if the building will be LEED certified (Leadership in Energy & Environmental Design) like the Trisan Centre. The LCBO does not independently seek LEED certification but is able to partner with landlords to achieve such certifica-

tion. The plaza landlord, Tribute Communities, is responsible for the building shell and the LCBO for the interior. Over the last five years, the government agency has built LEED Certified stores in Scarborough, Brooklyn, Gloucester, Oakville, Brantford, Whitby, Vaughan, Burlington, Markham and Richmond Hill. The Markham building even has a green roof!

No response regarding LEED certification or a green roof for the Nobleton LCBO was received from the developer in time for publication. We will let you know when this information is available.

five years ago!

Using responsible, sustainable methods, materials and technology to build one store in Nobleton will not have an earth shattering impact on King's overall sustainability into the future. However, it sets a high standard for all future retail and prestige employment developments such as those being planned in King City, Schomberg and elsewhere in Nobleton.

If council, staff and the general public continue to insist that these new buildings meet very high "green" standards, then King will be a cleaner, greener, energy efficient community of communities into the future.

In this way, the traffic from Nobleton, or more specifically the subdivisions, could only journey south to King Road and not use the 8th as an access road to other destinations.

Is it realistic? I don't really know, but it would be a far better outcome than allowing unfettered access, in terms of the protection of the 8th Concession and 15th Sideroads from significantly heavier traffic volumes.

The sad part, in my view, is that the Township, by not demanding that the developer pay for it, saddled the ratepayers of King Township with a massive road building expense, that unfortunately will, eventually be a priority project; despite all the reasonable, rational and logical arguments against it.

I'm sorry, Jane. I understand your position only too well, and frankly was against the size of the Slokker development right from the word go. Your road considerations were one of a number of issues that weren't carefully considered, but being in the position now, with all that's going ahead, I see no alternative to the eventual linking of the Metrus/Slokker development to the 8th Concession.

# Tuition Sealers boasts quality product, service

Being at the helm of his own business suits King's Taylor Monti just fine.

And rolling up his sleeves and serving the public is a far cry from his stack of business texts.

The third year business student at Trent University is one of two King Township residents who are part of the provincial Summer Company, administered by the York Small Business Enterprise Centre.

Students receive a \$3,000 grant to start up and run their businesses for the summer, while receiving mentoring and coaching throughout to help ensure a positive entrepreneurial experience and success.

Choosing the seasonal business of driveway sealing, Monti did a ton of research into the product, equipment and sales techniques. He launched Tuition Sealers as soon as the school term ended and he's been going door to door ever since.

He admitted door-to-door sales isn't for everyone, but it does hone your people skills. The networking and mentoring provided through the program is very helpful. He also approached others offering a similar service and sought their advice, which they gave freely.

Taylor says his product - Black Mac asphalt sealer - is the best that money can buy. Other sealants such as acrylic, cold tar emulsion, and water base sealants mere-

ly paint the top of your asphalt, leaving it still dry underneath. During winter thaw, the store-bought sealants will chip, peel and eventually flake off, and your asphalt underneath cracks.

Black Mac is the very substance that asphalt pavement is made from - a petroleum and oil-based product. Monti explained that when sprayed on the driveway, it doesn't just cover the top, but penetrates deep into the asphalt actually restoring its life, colour and appearance. This material dries very quickly and he can walk on it within 10 minutes. He does recommend a 24-hour drying period, though.

He admitted that spraying isn't "rocket science," but you have to cover the area properly and do the prep work. Before he starts, he cleans the driveway, pulls weeds, sweeps and uses a leaf blower to make sure the surface is clean.

The equipment is also key to success and Monti found a very decent used pump and sprayer.

So far, he's been serving King, Aurora and Barrie and is moving into Vaughan. Hitting the right neighbourhood is key, and often when one homeowner gets it done, others want it done, too. Monti's reputation has spread and he's already receiving referrals and even repeat customers.

He's learned that doing a good job and offering top-notch customer service goes a long way. He also stands behind his work and the product.

Being self-employed

allows Monti to work as long as he wants, or take two-hour lunches. Being his own boss is part of the lure.

When Monti heads back to university this fall, he'll have something many of his peers don't - the experience of running his own business.

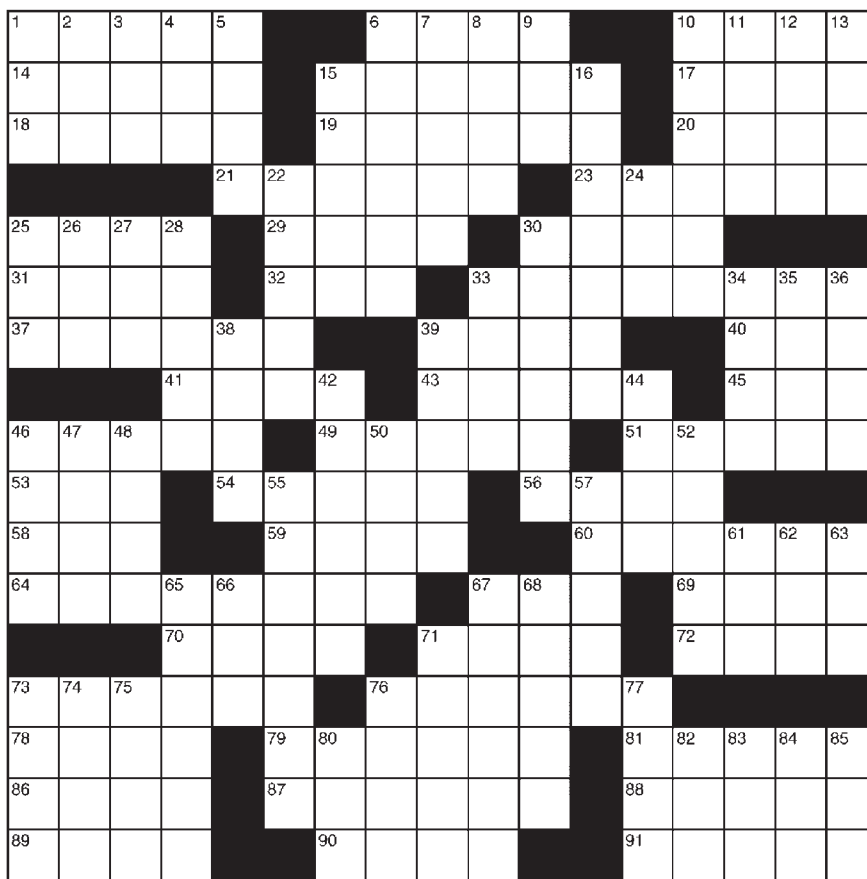

# Robert B. Somerville helps lay the groundwork for the future

## King's Spotlight on Business

From underground communications lines to massive oil pipelines, King's Robert B. Somerville is improving Canada's energy infrastructure, a few metres at a time.

The well known and well respected construction firm is a national leader in this niche industry, and King Township is fortunate they're calling this municipality home.

Since setting up shop in King in 1994, the company has continued to grow, diversify and improve, to service new forms of renewable energy infrastructure in wind and solar.

Their biggest current undertaking is a three-year project with the Inter Pipeline Fund, a major petroleum transportation, storage and natural gas liquids extraction business based in Calgary, Alberta.

Western Canada is booming, according to Somerville corporate vice-president Gord Butson. Canada is now a major oil producer and trends are moving towards pumping and processing more Canadian oil, and less from offshore sources. The oil industry is a major economic force and thanks to the IPF project north of Edmonton, Somerville is currently employing well over 1,000 people.

With its Western Canadian head office in Edmonton, Somerville is one

of the big players in the western oil and gas industry. The company also has many partnerships with gas and hydro companies in several provinces.

From utility upgrades to Union Station in downtown Toronto, to laying 48-inch pipelines, Somerville has done it all.

They're well positioned, well managed and have a solid strategic direction to lead the industry.

Butson noted they're well respected and with a solid track record they plan to be front and centre in Canada's growth.

"That respect and reputation gets you work," he observed.

With regards to Canada's oil production and price of gas at the pumps, Butson noted it's very costly to get the stuff out of the ground and refined. The price per litre reflects the huge investment in the industry.

Regardless of the job, it's people that fuel Somerville and it's people they work with that make it all worthwhile.

Butson, and Elizabeth Furlano, office manager and executive assistant, both noted Canada is wealthy in its unique communities, that differ from coast to coast.

Their work is seldom

boring, as each job is different and has its own unique challenges.

Somerville has its own equipment and assets and maintains one of the largest pipeline and utilities fleets in the country.

Staff are always learning and both Butson and Furlano noted they've learned a lot of patience over the years.

For more than 50 years, Robert B. Somerville has connected communities through the installation of infrastructure "that makes energy reliably flow, from generation to generation."

In 1954, Robert "Bud" Somerville, a Toronto-born pipeline contractor operating in the U.S., won a contract to install pipe in Ontario. He sent Jim Abraham to Toronto to become the company's first president. That same year, the company became a founding member of the Pipeline Association of Canada. In 1958, Robert McAlpine became an investor and, later, bought the balance of shares, with Robert B. Somerville Co. Ltd. becoming a McAlpine subsidiary.

Employees in the King City office are drawn from the local communities as often as possible. Staff experience with Somerville



ranges from newcomers to those who have been on staff since the company started. On the construction sites, personnel are also drawn from the local communities wherever possible. Many of the project workers look on Somerville as a preferred employer, returning to work with the company whenever the opportunity is available. This kind of consistency is key to building the relationships that make the company successful.

Butson did note that this type of work requires skilled workers and tradespeople, which are sometimes in short supply.

Its first directional drilling rig was purchased in 1989, making it one of the first to use the technology. The power and utilities division was launched in 1995. In 1997, Hydro Vac excavation was added as an alternative to mechanical digging. Its first renew-

able energy project was completed in 2003.

Locally, it has a good working relationship with York Region and King Township. It plans to increase the efficiency of its Head Office site in King City, as the demands for its services continue to increase.

Somerville handled the construction of King's infamous "Big Pipe."

Butson noted with their expertise and technology, they can do smaller projects within local towns in a less invasive manner. They also completed work in Kettleby with little disruption to area residents.

The company continues to explore and use new technologies to improve safety, quality, and customer satisfaction, and to reduce costs. Being a good corporate citizen, Somerville recognizes, and appreciates, its role in supporting the economy of

local communities by creating jobs and contributing to local charities such as King Township Food Bank, Southlake Hospital, MacKenzie Health and the United Way.

In addition to projects across Canada the company has worked in the Cayman Islands, the Dominican, and on a joint venture in Pennsylvania.

The projects range from small individual installations to major lines for such corporations as Greater Toronto Airport Authority, Bell Canada, Enbridge; from local municipalities like King Township to large cities like Calgary and Toronto.

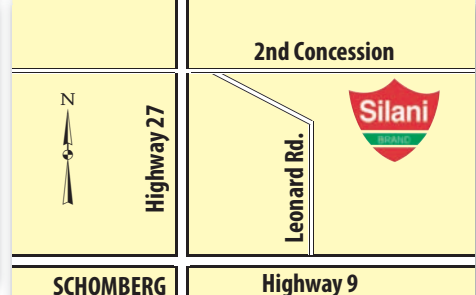

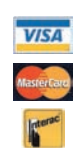

## King youngster is top fundraiser for Parkinson's

At just nine years old, Nat Bannister has made it his mission to help find a cure for Parkinson's. This summer the young Nobleton resident, along with his dad Doug, have worked hard and took on the challenge of participating in "Pedal-

ing for Parkinson's."

On July 12, the two traveled to Parry Sound for the annual event where they cycled a total of 370 kilometres over the course of a weekend.

The idea behind the event is that participants do a pedal stroke for every Canadian with Parkinson's.

Nat raised the most money of any other participant, collecting an incredible \$11,000 thus far and is still collecting pledges for the cause.

The target for this year's ride was \$75,000, but riders managed to net a whopping \$95,000 for Parkinson's research.

The cause is specifically important to them as Nat's grandpa was diagnosed with Parkinson's last year. Parkinson's is a neurodegenerative disease that currently has no cure.

Nat spends a lot of time with his grandfather and was enthusiastic about participating and helping to find a cure for Parkinson's and when Doug found out about the ride and put it to his son, Nat took no time to reply, "Is that even a question?"

"As an active cyclist I had looked for Parkinson's fundraising rides in the Toronto area but hadn't found any," Doug said in an interview a few weeks before the event. "The hills were tough and it was really challenging," he said.

In a previous interview, Nat expressed a large amount of enthusiasm in going to the Bobby Orr Hall of Fame while visiting Parry Sound. When they returned from the ride, he had quite a story about an encounter he had.

While out for dinner over the weekend in Parry Sound, Nat and Doug bumped into the hockey legend himself.

"It was more just kind of a starstruck, 'hi Mr. Orr' and he shook his hand and we got his autograph, so that was a good start to the weekend," Doug said.

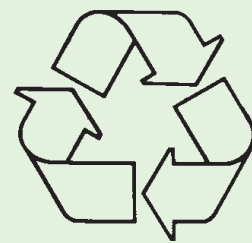

# Run for Southlake raised 24% more this year

Aurora council finally received the fruits of their labour as winners of the Municipal Challenge Cup.

After raising nearly \$10,000 for Southlake Regional Health Centre in the annual Nature's Emporium Run/Walk for Southlake – formally known as the Hartwell Challenge – the Municipal Challenge is a friendly competition amongst York Region municipalities to see who can raise the most for the facility

Now in its third year,

with previous winners including Newmarket and, most recently, King Township, it was finally Aurora's time to shine as the cup was presented to Mayor Geoffrey Dawe by Steve Hinder and Cortney Cassidy of the Southlake Regional Health Centre Foundation.

"We were here some time ago asking for your support for the Run for Southlake this year and I am really pleased to say we got it back in spades from the Town of Aurora," said Hinder, making the presentation. "Thanks to the municipalities in

the Southlake catchment area, every one of them participated this year.

"2013 saw growth in every area, including sponsorship, pledging, teams and registration. Over 1,460 people took part in this year's run, \$159,000 was raised in pledges and over 150 volunteers came out that day. I am proud to announce the net raised was \$226,000 which represents a 24 per cent increase over 2012. These funds will help projects such as the Diagnostic Imaging Unit, a \$16 million project that includes

a more advanced MRI. A second MRI will mean that at least 5,000 more scans can be performed each year and wait times for non-urgent patients will be reduced by as much as 76 per cent in the first year alone."

Figuring into the success at this year's event, which was held April 27 at the Aurora Community Centre, were seven team challenges, a school challenge won by Newmarket's Pickering College, a challenge amongst community groups won by the Aurora-Newmarket chapter of the Cana-

dian Federation of University Women, and a corporate challenge won by Turf Care.

Groups of family and friends also contributed to the success, along with individuals such as Barry Hartwell Spirit Award by embodying "the spirit of giving as Bob did," said Hinder.

"We had a bank challenge won by TD Banking – Banking on a Cure – and we had this Mayor's Municipal Challenge and it was won by the Town of Aurora. As residents, I know Cortney and I are

pretty proud of that!"

The Nature's Emporium Run/Walk for Southlake was originally founded as the Hartwell Challenge, named after Aurora's then-councillor Bob Hartwell who died running a marathon. The familiar logo features a silhouette portrait of Hartwell in action. It was also known as the A&B Courier Run/Walk for Southlake before the Newmarket grocery store purchased naming rights to this, and other Southlake endeavours, last year.
