## Full steam ahead for King's office relocation

King Township politicians are excited about the planned relocation of its municipal offices.

Councillors voted to move full steam ahead with its planned office move to the former Holy Name school site on King Road.

Councillors approved recommendations at its Aug. 24 meeting to proceed with a partial demolition and addition of the existing site. Council also agreed to proceed with talks with York Regional Police about including a sub-station in the new municipal complex.

"I'm excited that we will have a proper building for King Township," said Councillor Cleve Mortelliti. "I have been a councillor and an employee in this (current) building. It's high time we got moving."

Mayor Steve Pellegrini wants to get under way "as soon as possible," adding the preferred rebuild is fiscally responsible and provides a "community hub."

Councillor Bill Cober, known for being frugal, is anxious to get firm cost projections and a funding formula for the new digs. He believes the public wants to know where the money is coming from.

The bulk of the funding will come from the sale of the current municipal office and strip mall. In order to maximize the Township's return, "we want to sell this place shovel-ready," the mayor observed. The value will be "extremely high" if the new buyers can get going immediately after purchase.

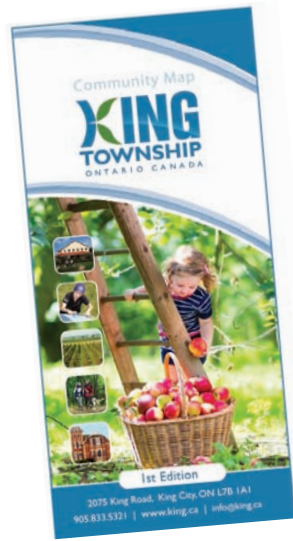

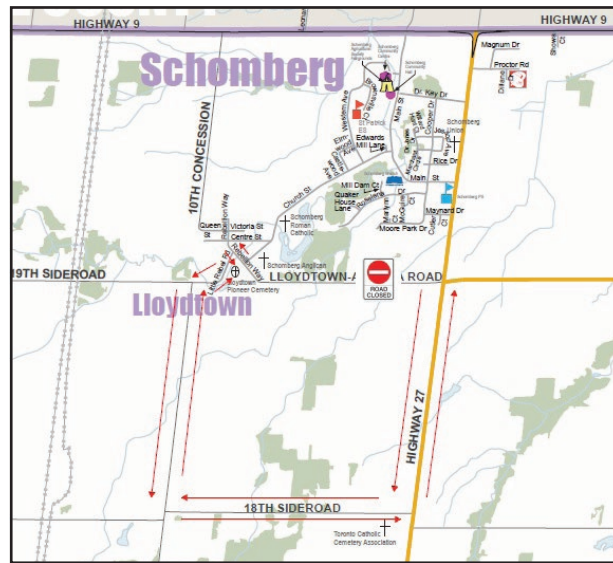

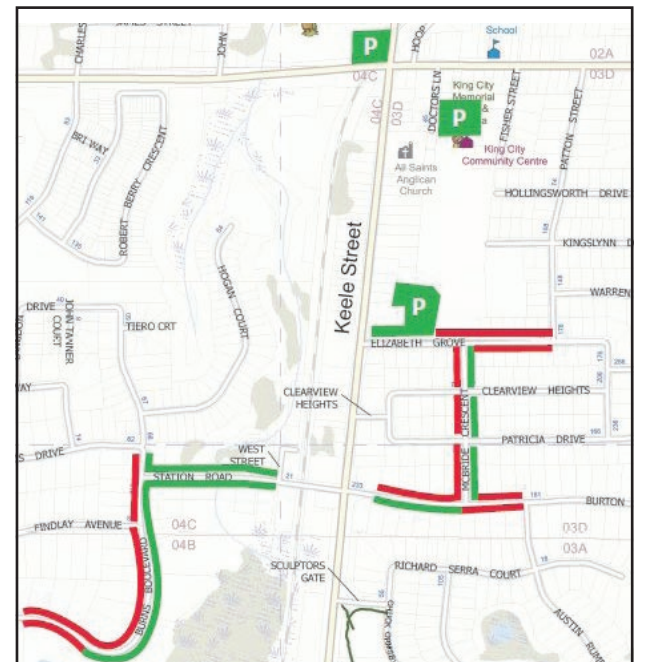

# Planned renovation meets objectives

The Township is looking at the necessary changes to permit some repurposing of the site with commercial and residential elements.

It will bolster village vitality and prosperity by providing a new location (the current municipal office in the strip mall) for additional commercial and housing.

CAO Susan Plamondon noted while the initial cost projects are high, the sale of the existing site, coupled with some DCs and potential "green" grants, will lessen the blow.

She told Cober that as the project matures, updates and a detailed financing plan will be presented to council.

Both senior staff and +VG consultants recommended going forward with the partial demolition and addition.

This option includes retaining the most functional part of the building - the two-storey portion. The one-storey section at the front will be demolished and an addition will be built to address the space requirements.

The study by +VG pegs the cost at between \$9 and \$10 million, exclusive of contingency, soft costs, furniture and equipment.

"Project MOVE" as it's been called, incorporates best practices in green building standards. The new offices will allow Township staff to operate more efficiently and effectively in providing services to the community.

"A new administrative/community use facility will not only enable the Township to better serve the community, but can also serve as a landmark and a meaningful symbol of the community's identity," according to CAO Susan

Plamondon.

One of council's objectives is to consider incorporating community uses within the building, making it a community hub.

Plamondon said very preliminary discussions were held with York Regional Police. A YRP presence in King has many advantages, not the least of which are a local presence and a share of the operating costs. Council directed staff to enter into more formal discussions with YRP with the ultimate goal of a sub-station within the building.

Thomas Wilson, of +VG Architects, updated councillors on their work to date. Their space needs assessment included interviews with staff in order to determine department placing and work stations throughout the building.

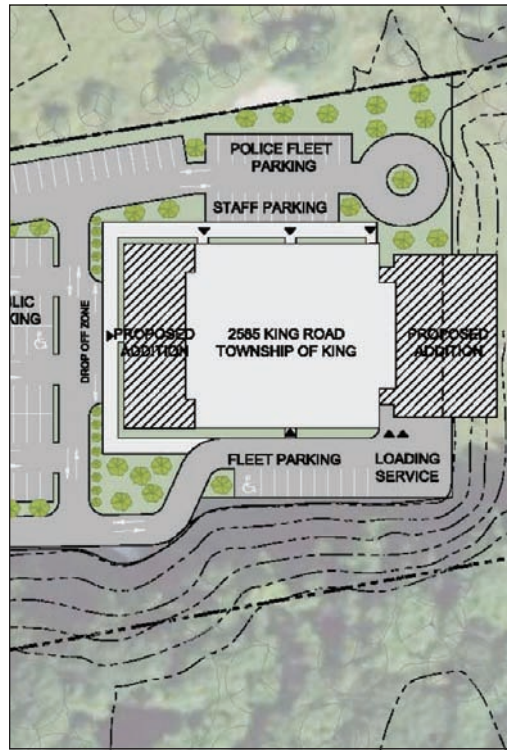
The site has many positive elements, not the least of which are the views and soccer field. Their preliminary designs took the Township's priorities into consideration - cost effectiveness, improved access for the public, accommodating community partners and longevity.

The structure, Wilson said, "has good bones ... much of it is well built."

The approved option meets all the objectives and "shows leadership and cost effectiveness."

Councillor Debbie Schaefer said she wanted to ensure the main foyer allows for ease of access by the public, and also provides flexibility.

Plamondon noted it does boast a centralized customer service area and has been designed to accommodate the bulk (roughly 80%) of common, day-to-day customer transactions. It will really be a one-stop centre.

## Earth's oceans are the real 'final frontiers'

*"The sea, once it casts its spell, holds one in its net of wonder forever."*

Humans are tied to the ocean and former U.S. President John F. Kennedy said when we go back to the sea, whether it is to sail or to watch, we are going back from whence we came.

He was, of course, referring to life's beginnings in the primordial ooze many eons ago.

I think many of us are drawn to the oceans, lakes and rivers that make up this beautiful blue-green ball flying through space. Maybe it is due to "whence we came." Or perhaps it has something to do with the fact our bodies themselves are 60% water.

Our planet, despite its name, is largely water (71% in fact). It should be called Sea, not Earth. But I digress.

Being a bit of science-fiction and astronomy buff, I've long been fascinated by space - "the final frontier." But what if that final frontier is closer than we think? What if that final frontier, which contains a host of wonders, secrets and mysteries, is right here, beneath our feet?

The vastness of the world's oceans have beckoned since we first gained our sea legs. We quickly learned that Mother Nature, and the oceans themselves, can be quite unforgiving to us mere mortals. That is not our home.

But it is home to countless species of fascinating creatures of all descriptions. It is home to mysterious life forms that we have yet to discover. And perhaps that's what makes it so enchanting

and alluring.

Who doesn't love the sound of the waves crashing on a hot, sandy beach? Who can resist jumping into those azure blue waters teeming with life? Who hasn't speculated what lies beneath?

You don't have to venture too far to whet your appetite for our fellow creatures.

My family and I enjoyed our recent trek to Ripley's Aquarium of Canada near the CN Tower.

The aquarium holds 5.7 million litres of water in its exhibits and shows marine and freshwater habitats from around the world. The aquarium is orga-

nized into nine galleries: Canadian Waters, Rainbow Reef, Dangerous Lagoon, Discovery Centre, The Gallery, Ray Bay, Planet Jellies, Life Support Systems and the Shoreline Gallery. It is home to some 16,000 animals.

All are interesting in their own way. The Canadian Waters exhibit features animals from all the bodies of water surrounding Canada. Some animals featured in this exhibit include alewife, largemouth bass, American lobster, wolf eel, lump fish, giant pacific octopus and china rockfish. Who knew?

The Rainbow Reef features animals from the Indo-Pacific regions and there colour abounds. Some of its inhabitants are Picasso triggerfish, humbug dascyllus, emperor angelfish, pajama cardinalfish, unicorn surgeonfish. The exhibit also features an interactive dive show.

Our favourite, especially as summer draws to a close, is the shark exhibit. Who doesn't love those deadly predators?

The Dangerous Lagoon is an underwater tunnel with a moving sidewalk, which is the aquarium's largest tank. Some of the featured animals in this thrilling exhibit are sand tiger shark, sandbar shark, roughtail stingray, green sawfish and green sea turtles.

As you walk along the path, the large, menacing sharks simply stroll by. You can see right into their cold eyes. Marvellous and so cool.

In "Mother Nature's Art Gallery," you can see some odd creatures like the red lionfish, electric eel, lined seahorse, weedy sea dragon and the archerfish.

Let's not forget "Planet Jellies." The

exhibit has colour changing displays with five different species of jellyfish - pacific sea nettle, moon jelly, spotted jelly, and upside-down jelly.

These are perhaps the most fascinating creatures on our planet. They swim, eat and sting, all without eyes, a digestive or nervous system, or even a brain. Jellyfish have roamed the seas between 500 and 700 million years, making them the oldest multi-organ animal.

The Ray Bay exhibit is home to three species of stingrays - bonnethead shark, cownose ray, and the southern stingray.

We don't have many real aquariums around, so this is a must see.

While some people don't like seeing animals in captivity, I believe these sea creatures will live longer, healthier lives here than in the wild.

Ripley's serves to foster education, conservation and research, while providing fun and entertainment for visitors

"By showcasing the beauty and significance of our aquatic world and the animals within it, we will both entertain and inspire while encouraging you to respect and protect the waters of the world."

And that's what we took away. While I've lived long enough to see many things in my life, I was literally in awe of seeing these wonderfully odd creatures up close and personal.

We humans tend to think we are at the top of the food chain, but these gentle beasts have roamed our oceans for a long time. They've adapted.

It's their home. Why not sneak a peak of them in their habitat?

## Selective no parking zones

One of the last things that my husband and I thought about during the process of purchasing our first home was parking. With more pressing issues, parking enforcement was the farthest thing from our mind.

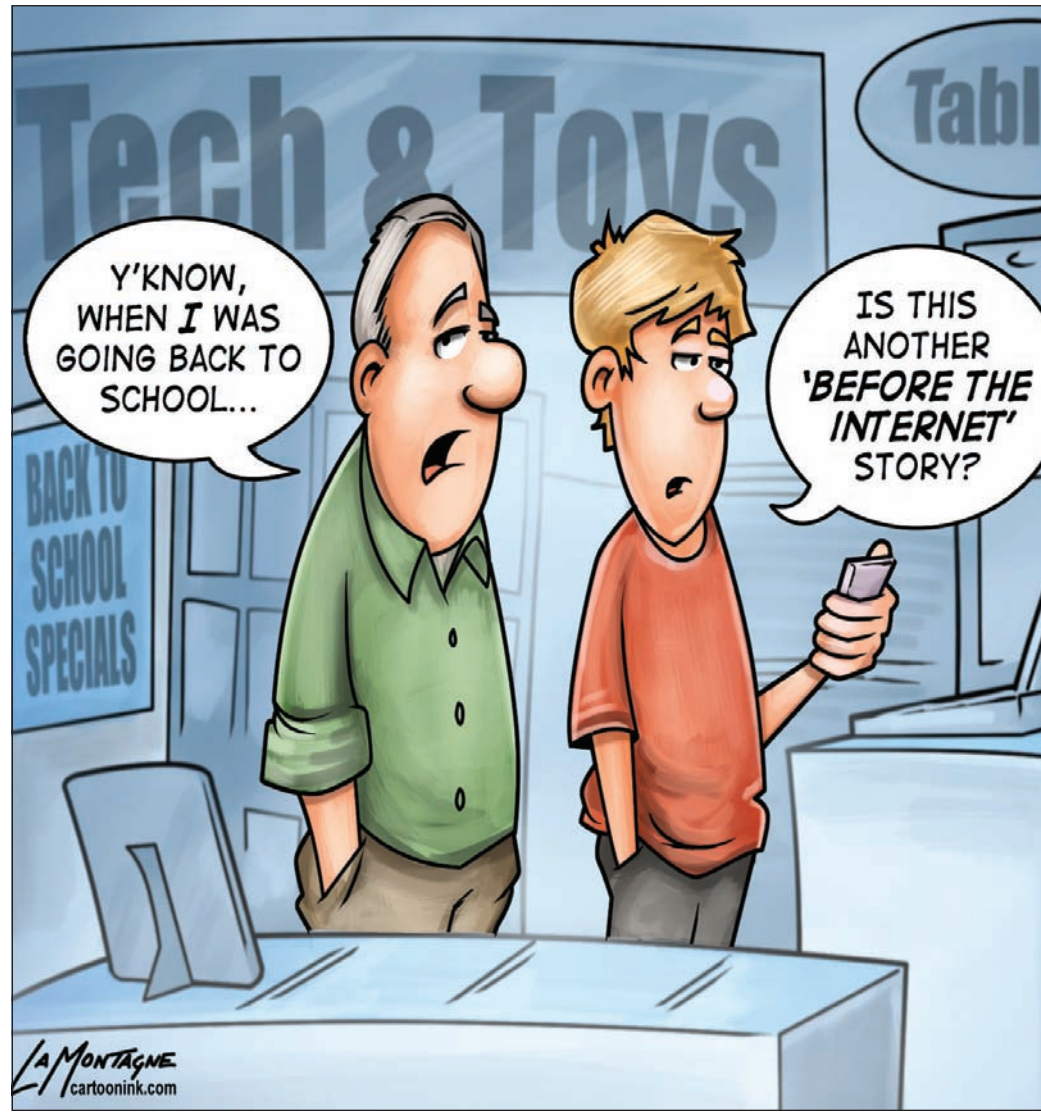
Never, in the few years, that we have lived in this newly developed subdivision in Schomberg, has an issue with parking ever presented itself - until now. So why is it that several no parking signs attached to wooden posts have been strewn in specific areas along one of the major streets in the subdivision? Why did it escalate to this without any notice to residents?

Not only have these signs posed as an inconvenience for guests coming to visit but they are an eyesore. With the exorbitant amount of property tax that residents in King Township pay annually, I would have thought that they could have sprung for a more modest alternative such as metal rather than untreated wooden fence posts.

I would like to point out that by alternative parking I mean parking in the areas within the subdivision that do not possess these no parking signs (like so many residents do daily) as there is no overflow parking options for residents or their guests. When asked what prompted the implementation of these signs, I was told by a Township official that emergency and Township vehicles are having a hard time manoeuvring around the tight corners of the street due to the cars parked on the road. That in turn begs the question- Aren't all roadways created equal? Why are the corners on this specific street too tight for emergency vehicles to safely pass yet other corners within the subdivision are not?

Why this now becoming an issue? And why are parking infractions not being enforced in other areas of the subdivision and the township as a whole? Namely to those cars that park on the road for a period of longer than three hours or the cars that block the sidewalks and overhang on the road. Both are direct infractions in the township yet there are never any tickets handed out to people except for those in the no parking zone. When asked why it is that only certain individuals are receiving parking infractions, I was told by a township official that it is usually due to personal complaint that was made to the parking enforcement department directly.

# ORPP scheme bad for families and businesses

In the two weeks since the Premier released a few more details on the mandatory Ontario Retirement Pension Plan (ORPP), investigative journalists have asked more critical questions about the need for this plan, how it will work, how much it will cost, what will the money be used for, and why the Premier is single-mindedly focused on the ORPP when today's economy is so unstable.

As well, two fresh public opinion polls (ForumResearch & Mainstreet Research) show that opposition to the

ORPP has grown from 28% to 40%. It seems the more people hear, the less they like.

Recommendations for further reading include the Ontario Chamber of Commerce's letter to the Premier.

Premier Wynne's announcement of design features of the ORPP does nothing to alleviate the concerns of businesses and working families. The government is still assessing who exactly will be included in the plan.

It is unclear how the first benefit cheque could be paid out in 2022, when the plan will have been fully running for only a year. It is still unclear how many

hundreds of millions of dollars the plan will cost to administer and whether the government (taxpayer) or only the ORPP members will fund the administration.

The Premier just keeps saying, "It's the right thing to do," as if good intentions ensure good outcomes.

Businesses from the smallest member of the Canadian Federation of Independent Business (CFIB) or the Ontario Chamber of Commerce, to Magna, Canadian Tire and Ford Motor Co., all agree that this is an unacceptable burden that affects them like a payroll tax. And when I speak to working families, they don't know their take-home-pay is going to be reduced by 2%.

People are going to lose their jobs because of this pension plan. Small businesses in particular will be forced to reduce their staff to compensate for the mandatory, matching contributions from each employer and employee.

The Ontario PC Caucus continues to oppose the ORPP because:

- The government has not conducted a cost-benefit analysis on the ORPP – we

have no data to support the ORPP.

- The ORPP will cause more unemployment in Ontario.
- The ORPP will cause more businesses to close or move.
- The ORPP will reduce household income.
- The ORPP will hurt lower income earners the most and will hurt the chances of those who are unemployed now.
- The ORPP will make doing business in Ontario even more expensive, less competitive, and will be a further disincentive for investment.

In the face of an ever-increasing provincial debt and deficit, soaring energy prices, and the threat of a cap and trade tax, the Premier has created a smoke-screen which allows her to play her charade with the federal government. It does not make sense to sacrifice jobs in this economy – and that's what the ORPP will do. The Premier's plan does not make sense. One reason the federal government has never said it would help Ontario with its plan is because the Premier has never provided anything more than an emotional argument.

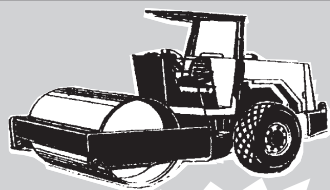

# RFPs released for Seneca's King campus expansion

Infrastructure Ontario (IO) and Seneca College have released a request for proposals (RFP) inviting the three shortlisted teams to submit proposals to design, build and finance the college's King Campus phase 1 expansion.

The shortlisted teams each include a developer/builder, designer and a financial advisor.

The teams were shortlisted following a request-for-qualifications (RFQ) process that began in April 2014. The RFQ selection criteria looked at the teams' construction capability, experience and financial capacity to deliver a project of this size and scope.

The three teams will have approximately six months to prepare RFP submissions. Once received, IO and Seneca College will evaluate the proposals, select a preferred bidder, and then negotiate the final contract. The entire process will be overseen by a fairness monitor

and the successful bidder will be announced in the summer of 2016.

The Seneca King Campus is home to approximately 3,500 full-time students. The first phase of the expansion will create space for an additional 1,450 students, while enhancing the quality of student learning and campus life. When this project is complete, the King Campus location will provide teaching and learning opportunities for approximately 5,000 full-time students.

The King Campus phase 1 expansion includes approximately 25 new classrooms, computer labs, specialty labs for training health-care practitioners, a library, learning commons, and student study space.

A new student area, which will include a multi-purpose athletic and recreation space featuring a gymnasium,

fitness centre, informal study areas and event spaces, partially funded by the Seneca Student Federation and the Student Athletic Association.

IO and the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities are working together with Seneca to procure and deliver the new facilities.

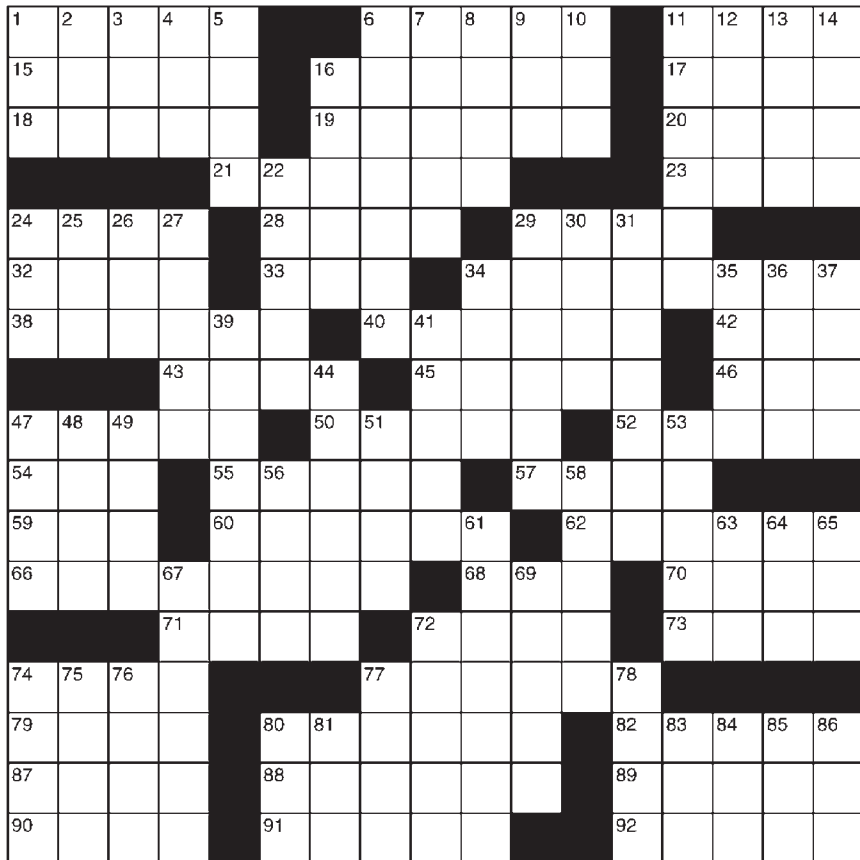

# Chief Ross Kennedy was a genuine trailblazer

We should all remember the efforts of those who blazed the trails, when those trails didn't even exist.

Looking around the meeting room at the Nobleton fire station, history unfolds through photographs and newspaper clippings. The history of the volunteer force and the station itself is filled with heart, dedication and commitment.

Ross Kennedy, who served as Nobleton's first fire chief from 1959 through 1996, will be remembered for many "firsts." He set the stage for a local force that is considered one of the best in the province.

Kennedy, who passed away July 19 at 88, will be remembered at a service Thursday, Sept. 3 at the Manor. The public is welcome to attend the service, which runs 6-9 p.m. at the Manor, located at 16750 Weston Road in Kettleby.

Taking the helm of the Nobleton service in 1959, Kennedy went to work quickly, securing the needed equipment for his men. He helped spearhead a fundraising drive to raise the money to purchase a 1943 International pumper truck, which came from an airforce base. There was no station at this time, and the truck simply moved



around town. Long-serving retired captain Terry Phillipps recalls that on occasion, other vehicles, including a milk truck, had to be moved out of the way to access the pumper. That truck is still in good condition, currently owned by James Dick in nearby Caledon.

Phillipps noted the open-air cab

presented some challenges, especially in the winter.

Phillipps also noted that in those early days, six phones were strategically placed around town, so when people called, they all rang and tripped the fire alarm.

In 1964, they purchased a used ambulance and the Nobleton Firefighters and Ambulance Association was born. In those days, the firemen actually sent out bills to residents who called for an ambulance.

In 1966, they acquired the first pager system, which resembled a large, portable radio. Fire was dispatched by King City Police at the time.

When York Regional Police took over in 1972, the fire departments were dispatched through Vaughan.

Acquiring equipment was no small task in the early years. It was still relatively expensive. Government funding allowed them to purchase a 1965 Thibault pumper for \$15,000.

The original fire hall was built in the early '60s and a library was added on in the early 1970s.

Things began to take off with the arrival of regional government in 1974, but King's three stations still operated separately, with their own chiefs.

Phillipps recalled that a new pumper arrived in 1978 with a price tag of \$55,000. When it was replaced in 1993, the cost had more than doubled.

Kennedy made sure that his crews and station always had the most up to date equipment as possible. Volunteers and members of the Nobleton Lions Club rolled up their sleeves and pitched in when needed.

Firefighters and Lions worked together to finish the upper level of the current station. Kennedy had led his dedicated team of volunteers for decades, and the local complement grew from 25 to 42 today.

Phillipps said Kennedy was a problem-solver, looking after his crews. He ensured the service had the most current equipment and training, including introducing CPR. Kennedy also had the distinction of never having a fire structure related death on his 37-year watch. In the early 1990s, Kennedy also served on the Fire Fighters' Association of Ontario.

Phillipps said one of the biggest local fires occurred in 1978 when the Nobleton general store went up in flames in the wee hours of the morning. It was located at the southeast corner of King and Highway 27. It

was fully engulfed by the time firefighters got the call and Kennedy had requested help from nearby King City. The flames could be seen as far away as Highway 400 and Steeles Avenue. The all-wood building was destroyed but no one was injured. Firefighters worked hard to save the adjacent Nobleton Feed Mill.

While the photos on the wall may represent a time capsule of the history of the department, the real stories are in the hearts and souls of those who continue to serve.

They all owe Ross Kennedy a tip of the cap for paving the way.

ed in the first-ever Community Map for King.

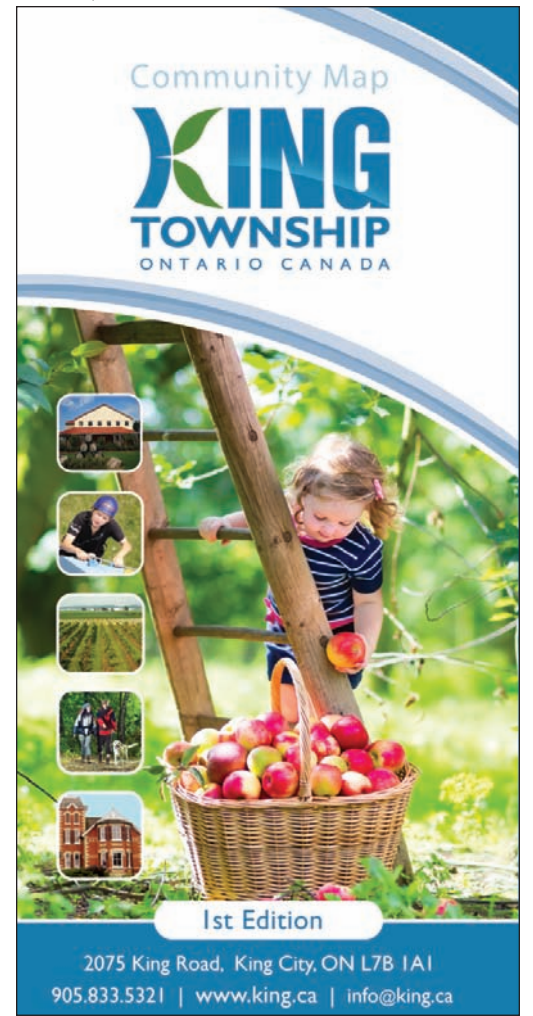
"I am delighted to finally be able to hold in my hand a copy of the

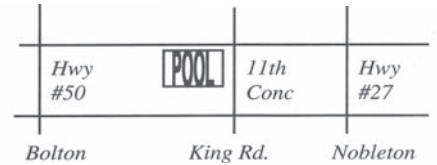

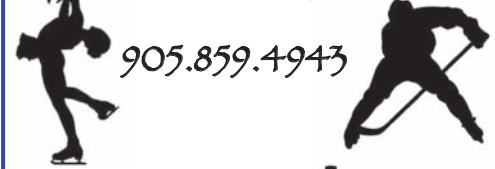

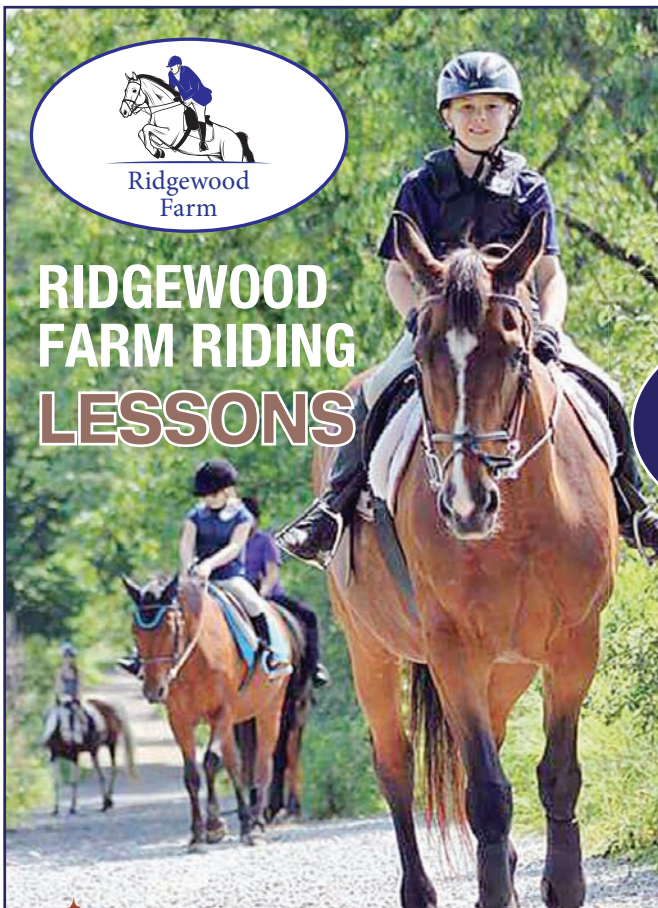

## King equestrian recalls Canada's first equestrian Olympic medal

When John Rumble rode astride his gelding Cilroy (pronounced Kilroy) in the 1956 Summer Olympic Games in Stockholm, it was not in his mind set to bring a medal home to Canada.

Yet he, along with teammates Jim Elder and Brian Herbinson, rode the horse he had only worked with for a few months to Olympic bronze.

On top of their inexperience with each other, Cilroy was not a pure thoroughbred. He was also crossed with a coach horse, one who had never even jumped in a horse show before.

"No one thought he would be going to the Olympics," said Rumble.

A friend of his, Harold Crang, had offered up Cilroy after Rumble's own horse was put out of commission. Although the dressage and show-jumping legs of eventing haven't changed much over the years, the grueling 22-mile cross-country section that was a part of the Olympics until the 1940s was hard on both horse and rider, Rumble weighing 20 pounds more than the 165-pound minimum.

"In those days, a rider who fell could remount and continue on," said Rumble. "Spectators would catch your horse for you and vault you back into the saddle."

Today, a fall means automatic elimination.

The Cheltenham-born horse surprised the world, and laid the roots of equestrian in King, with his Olympic victory. Rumble and Cilroy were the strongest member of the team, accruing the least amount of negative points.

Rumble, a staple in the King equestrian community, recently gave a talk at the King Township Museum where he commented on the state of the horse set within the area. He said although his days of competition faded with his Olympic experience, equestrian is still very much in his blood.

"Living in this area, it's not difficult to see the inspiration of equestrian everywhere," said Rumble, who added his signature to one of the horses in the area's recent art installation Parade of Horses. "It's deeply rooted in King, and the amount of quality farms in the area is astounding."

The talk was even given the name "King: The Kentucky of Canada."

Having laid roots in King 18 years ago, Rumble now helps younger riders along the same path he followed over a half-century ago. He now works with Selena O'Hanlon of Kingston, who rides his four-year old gelding Foxwood High, aka "Woody."

O'Hanlon and Woody recently represented Canada as alternates for eventing in the 2015 Pan Am Games at Caledon Equestrian Park.

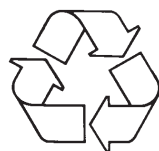
