#### Magna puts move to King on hold

Magna International has put its move out of Aurora to King Township on hold until 2022, according to the company.

The auto part manufacturer, which is one of Aurora's largest and most prominent employers announced Monday they have extended their lease on their Aurora headquarters until 2022, after pausing the move to King Township.

The company previously announced its intention to relocate to an extensive new corporate headquarters in King Township with a 2017 target.

"Magna confirms that the project to construct a new corporate headquarters building in King Township has been put on hold," said Tracy Fuerst, the company's director of corporate communications, said in a statement. "We have recently completed discussion with our landlord and have reached terms to extend our lease for the Aurora headquarters building until 2022.

"This provides Magna an opportunity to monitor current macro-economic conditions and to continue evaluating our future need. We are extremely appreciative to King Township for their hard work, support and professionalism provided throughout the development process."

King Mayor Steve Pellegrini said while council and staff are disappointed that the project is on hold, "we understand Magna's decision in light of today's challenging global economy. Since Magna is keeping its land in King Township, King will be ready to work with them again. The process to construct such a facility is going to take three years realistically."

Pellegrini added that Magna representatives have made it very clear that they have appreciated the efforts of council and staff in support of their application. Magna does intend to complete the zoning process. King will encourage them to continue the site plan approval process, too.



# More land added to Happy Valley Forest

A generous donation by a local resident has added more natural land to the Nature Conservancy of Canada's Happy Valley Forest.

The conveyance of a 26-acre parcel to NCC came as good news to Township councillors, and the parties have vowed to work together to accommodate the needs of the local equestrian commu-

The land swap included a transfer of the 26 acres from Mary Lou Rose on the 17th Sideroad, for heritage conservation purposes. The plan also requires the lands be "sterilized" and protected from any building. A 2.2-acre piece will be transferred back to Rose for residential purposes.

The properties consist mainly of dense deciduous forest of Happy Valley. Under the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan, conveying land for conservation is permitted and these transfers don't create any new lots for development.

As it stands, permitted uses of the land are restricted under the ORMCP zone category. Rose is further asking a more restrictive definition of Forest

Management that manages woodlands Township and equestrian community and provides outdoor recreation activities.

There has been a request by local horse riders to have access to Happy Valley lands. The zoning will provide uses "consistent with historic activity."

Mark Stabb, of the NCC, said they purchased the adjacent piece from Ms. Rose and the transfer of the small portion helps her with the laneway. NCC has been working hard since 2001 putting together some 773 acres in Happy Valley for public use.

He said based on provincial models, public trails are typically used for hiking, not riding.

NCC is growing its network in King and piecing together parcels is like putting a puzzle together. He said it's a constant balance between public use and conservation.

He said he hopes to organize a meeting among trail users and get input from equestrians. He did point out that NCC doesn't manage horse trails and so has nothing to base their policies on.

He did say they are looking at equestrian use for the Glen Echo property, but there is work to be done before that happens. He hopes to work with the to create a sustainable trail network.

Catering to all interests is a juggling

A resident on the 7th Concession said NCC is a responsible organization and land donors typically want the acres preserved and conserved, not to create a "playground" of sorts. It's still private property, he pointed out.

An 8th Concession resident said there are some great hiking trails in Happy Valley, used by local residents. Since King is part of "Horse Country," equestrian access should at least be considered.

Councillor Cleve Mortelliti said the Township is working on a comprehensive trail strategy and it makes sense to bring everyone to the table to come up with a system that makes sense.

Councillor Linda Pabst said they've ridden their horses through Happy Valley for decades and it's traditionally been open for equestrians.

The equestrian sector in King needs to be supported she said, adding "I hope we can work something out to make everyone happy.'

# Municipalities share their concerns

GTHA mayors and chairs gathered last week as former Mississauga mayor Hazel McCallion, the ex-officio advisor to the Premier on issues within the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area, hosted a summit.

Mayors and chairs heard from their colleagues on the Province's Co-Ordinated Land Use Planning Review. Chair McCallion called the meeting as a direct result of the GTHA municipalities raising serious concerns on the Province's proposed amendments to the Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe and Greenbelt Plan.

"We heard consistent messages from the mayors and chairs, related to the proposed density targets being too high, about what their cities and towns will look like under proposed Plan, as that certain types of density will end up in areas that do not have the necessary planned or existing transit, infrastructure, community services and corresponding financial investments to support that type of growth," said Mc-Callion. "This comes with zero consideration for the financial and economic implications to the municipalities and regions. I am very concerned that these Plans are absent of any direction or planning for economic growth."

The summit was an opportunity for municipal colleagues to collectively share concerns and recommendations on the proposed draft amendments to the Greenbelt and Growth Plans, which councils are bringing forward through staff reports to be submitted to the Province by the Oct. 31 deadline.

"I heard overwhelming concern today from my municipal colleagues on the proposed density and intensification targets," said McCallion. "Some Municipalities are clear they just cannot support them. Some say that they should be applied to areas where it makes the best planning sense. What's clear is that the Province has not looked at the impact of the proposed policies on each municipality and it cannot be applied the same way across the GTHA. This is not evident-based planning."

McCallion will use the summit findings to inform her formal report to the Premier on the multitude of issues impacting GTHA municipalities and their residents as a result of the Proposed

Plans. Specifically, McCallion is concerned on how the Plans will impact affordability and housing choice.

The proposed amendments to the Growth Plan come with a requirement the current Designated Greenfield Area density of 50 residents and jobs per hectare be increased to 80 residents and jobs per hectare, and the intensification target for built up areas is proposed to increase from 40 to 60%.

"The message was clear - one size does not fit all. As a group, the municipalities are united in opposing this approach which does not respect individual city building process and differences across the GTHA regions," said McCallion. "Local government is closest to the people. Municipalities need to make local decisions, and it will be the municipalities that are left to implement these Plans at a time when we are only beginning to see the impacts of the first Greenbelt and Growth Plans. We recognize it's very hard for the Province to understand the differences among municipalities but they cannot be ignored."

"The Town of Caledon went ever further with a council resolution that requests the Province, "... lower the proposed ... target(s) to reasonable levels more appropriate to Caledon's current density targets within the Region of

King Township planning staff have said we cannot support the levels of intensification being proposed.

With regard to the Greenbelt Plan, the York Region staff report calls on the Province to: "Develop a process to review boundaries associated with the Greenbelt Plan and ORMCP in response to individual landowner requests."

Councillor Debbie Schaefer attended the summit, noting there is very significant concern about the magnitude of changes in the Growth Plan and the speed for implementing those changes.

All speakers and all representatives of the municipalities identified the proposal for region-wide density targets as being a problem – one size does not fit all was the refrain. Many identified the problem of building the targeted densities and the intensification without the public transit being in place.


"This has been something I have frequently identified as we are looking at development applications," she said.

"I questioned why the definition of 'infrastructure' in the Oak Ridges Moraine would now include waste management systems. As the ORM was established to protect aguifers and water sources such infrastructure is surely inappropriate."

Schaefer added the amended plans are not specific enough in the role of municipalities when new energy infrastructure is contemplated. Disappointment was expressed by some that the proposed amendments do not include significant expansion of Greenbelt as the proposal to include urban river valleys does not achieve much as those valleys are already protected by conservation regulations.

"What would have been meaningful was to protect the headwaters of various water courses."

Several commented that new financial tools and more funding is required to deliver the new communities. Development charges need to be increased and they must include 100% of costs. The Province needs to provide financing or new revenue sources as taxpayers cannot be expected to fund.





# DESIGN On King

## The Art of the **Bookcase**

No matter what size of home we live in, from condominium, to townhouse, to large home on a rolling property, it is often the final touches that make a space feel polished. But the reality is by the time we have tackled the big jobs.....finally the basement is done, or the kitchen is renovated, maybe you've wallpapered an accent wall or primped the powder room..... there is decidedly less enthusiasm for tackling "The Dressing of the Bookcase"!

Here are a few steps to help you get there:

First, decide if you want this unit to be mostly decorative, or functional? This may require a family meeting... or debate? Bring negotiating tools to trump your opposition if necessary. A good looking bookcase will not have more than 50% functional use.

Second, choose 3 design elements you wish to use. These will be the elements that anchor your finished product. Design elements are: shape, texture, colour, and scale.

Third step is to find the items that fall under each category.

Remember you will need multiples of each.

In the bookcase above, charcoal is the "Colour" element; covered books of similar size are the "form" element; with both metallic and matte finishes acting as "texture" elements. The hunting and gathering for this step may involve trips to the attic, flea markets, or your fav accessory shops! Dare I say it again? You will need multiples!

The fourth and final step: placement using the "zig zag method". Starting at the top shelf, place larger decorative pieces from each category, then repeat them down the shelves in zig zag patterns. The eye loves to find harmony in repetition as it travels.

The result is a varied and interesting display with a sense of calm and cohesion.

The well dressed bookcase is a beautiful finishing touch to any space, and will likely receive as many compliments as the holiday menu.





#### Villanova runs in memory of former student

A special day on the Villanova College calendar year after year, the 2016 Terry Fox Run was a little closer to the hearts of the school's students and staff

The highly successful annual run, held Friday around the campus in King City, was in memory of Giuseppina Gurreri, whose life was taken by cancer after her tenure at Villanova.

Giuseppina passed away from a long battle with colon cancer last November, at the age of 21. Diagnosed at the age of 16, she was in her Grade 10 year at Villanova at the time.

"She ran her first Terry Fox Run in Grade 9, but by the time it came around again in a duration of a year, her life changed a great deal," said Giuseppina's

In total, she went through 48 rounds of chemotherapy over the course of five years. She spent roughly 128 days during that time undergoing chemo, with over 300 days spent overnight in the hospital.

"You can only imagine being a teenager and having to deal with these things most will never face in a lifetime," said Adrianna. "This is who we run for - people

like my sister." Despite the battle she faced, Giuseppina's brother, Alfonso, said his sister was 'as positive as she could be in the situation she was in."

"She never let the fact that she had cancer stop her from being a normal teen," said Alfonso. "Almost every nurse or doctor at the hospital knew her by name because of her positive attitude and friendliness."

When she had the opportunity, Giuseppina became a face for Villanova's Terry Fox Run, which has become one of the top schools in Ontario in terms of funds raised year after year. Over an 11-year history, the school has managed to raise over \$300,000 for cancer research.

Guiseppina would speak annually at Villanova's run.

"Something my sister said at a run a few years back was, if you break up the word cancer, the word 'can' is right there," said Alfonso. "Our sister has tremendous courage, but couldn't have done so without the help and support of everyone at Villanova."

Before the run, the school presented the Gurreri family with a cheque for just under \$2,000 raised for Sick Kids Hospital.

"Despite her struggles, she always made herself available for the Terry Fox Run," said Stuart Stanbury, co-chair of the athletic department. "Sometimes she would send video footage, or be the starter for the race, but I think everyone that was here when she came and gave her first speech for Terry Fox remembers that day a little more vividly than others."
