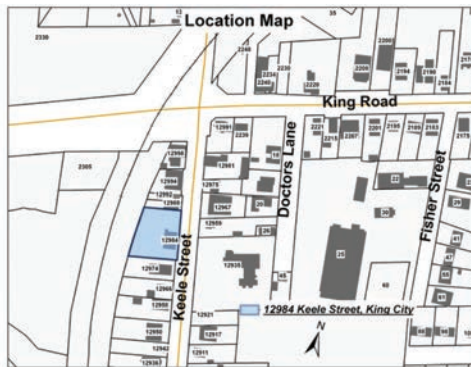

**PROPOSAL**

The subject application proposes:

- The purpose of the Official Plan Amendment application is to increase the permitted density and height policies identified for the Core Area to provide for a 4 storey mixed use building containing 20 rental apartments and 6 commercial units at grade. The purpose of the Zoning By-law Amendment application is to establish a site specific (CAK-X) zone to permit the height and density to facilitate the development together with some exceptions to the general provisions and parking requirements of the by-law. A Site Plan Development application has also submitted with the detailed design for the project.

## Scheer greeted by wave of enthusiasm

Andrew Scheer's visit to Vaughan last week sparked a massive wave of enthusiasm from Conservative candidates across the GTA.

The Kleinburg-area Jan Paderewski Park was packed with a sea of blue, along with Toronto and national media, to hear the Conservative leader kick off the federal election campaign in Ontario.

His main message is one of optimism, and a vow to put more money back in the pockets of hard-working Canadians.

He said he "can't wait to take our plan across the country" and fight for

Canadian jobs. He's adamant about helping the middle class, acknowledging today's essentials are more expensive for average families. Under the current federal government, he sees even higher taxes to come.

It's not average citizens who get ahead under Justin Trudeau, but rather "Liberal insiders." He noted Canadians have had four years of the Trudeau leadership, which featured fired "whistle blowers" and an RCMP investigation.

"He's (Trudeau) lost the moral ability to govern," he said. Scheer is admittedly an optimist and some say he smiles too much.

"It's hard not to smile when you have amazing candidates like Anna Roberts (King-Vaughan)" and an amazing and diverse group of candidates across the GTA and Canada. "It's hard not to smile when you have the right plan."

He told the enthusiastic crowd numbering well over 500 that it's time "for you to have a government that finally gets it," especially after "four years of being neglected and ignored."

He stressed that citizens are just getting by and they want a break. Middle class Canadians are struggling and doing the best they can. They "deserve a government that will help ... we have a plan to ... put more money back in your pocket."

## The world's lefties are an interesting lot

*"God made everyone right-handed; the truly gifted overcome it!"*

It's nice to be recognized by your peers, and the rest of the world.

For the first time, scientists have identified the genetic differences associated with left-handedness, a trait found in 10% of the human population.

These genetic variants result in differences in brain structure, which mean that left-handed people have better verbal skills than the right-handed majority.

I might add written skills too, but I don't want to brag.

The study, conducted by scientists from the University of Oxford and published in the journal *Brain*, is the first to identify which genetic variants separate the lefties from the righties.

The research could suggest a correlation between left-handedness and superior verbal skills. Further research must be conducted to test this potential advantage, however. The gene LR-RTM1 is a strong contributing factor for left-handedness. Scientists discovered the gene during a study of dyslexic children and believe it is inherited from the father.

Left-handers exhibit, on average, a more developed right brain hemisphere, which is specialized for processes such as spatial reasoning and the ability to rotate mental representations of objects.

The corpus callosum – the bundle of nerve cells connecting the two brain hemispheres – tends to be larger in left-handers. I've long espoused that mine is bigger!

This suggests that some left-handers have an enhanced connectivity between the two hemispheres and hence superior information processing. One theory suggests that living in a world designed for right-handers could be forcing southpaws to use both hands, thereby

increasing connectivity. These peculiarities may be the reason why left-handers seem to have an edge in several professions and the arts. Lefties tend to lean towards things like music, creative arts, architecture, chess and more.

I love tiny, detailed models of pretty much everything and even adding a personal touch to out-of-the-box miniatures. I can be a bit of a perfectionist at times.

I know I'm in the minority but it's time to gather our forces and join the rebellion! It's time we put an end to inconsiderate devices: pens at the bank attached on the right side; always reading metric on a measuring cup; leaping over the spirals in a notebook, and using can openers and scissors. I live my life in dark bathrooms because I can never find the light switch on the left wall!

It's not just the devices themselves, but most things are positioned for easy access by the right hand. It's no wonder

our lifespans are a bit shorter, many of us succumbing to injury caused by the righties. This may or may not be intentional!

Left-handers may be one of the last unorganized minorities in society because we have no collective power and no real sense of common identity. We have been criticized, "changed," and even burned at the stake for being different.

At various times in history, left-handedness has been seen as many things: a nasty habit, a mark of the devil, a sign of neurosis, rebellion, criminality, and homosexuality. On the plus side, it has also been seen as a trait indicating creativity and musical abilities. Famous left-handed intellectuals include Albert Einstein, Isaac Newton, Charles Darwin, and Benjamin Franklin. And, 20% of all Mensa members are left-handed.

The word "left" in English comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lyft," which means weak or broken. The German for left-handed is linkisch, which means awkward, clumsy, and maladroit. In Italian, the word is mancino, which is derived from "crooked" or "maimed" and is also used to mean deceitful or dishonest. In Russian, to be called a left-hander (levja) is a term of insult.

In Latin, the word for left is sinister, related to the noun sinistrum. Ambisister means "clumsy on both sides."

Among the Eskimos, every left-handed person is viewed as a potential sor-

cerer. In Morocco, left-handers are considered to be a s'ga, a word that means either a devil or a cursed person.

Now for some rational thinking – the Incas thought left-handers were capable of healing and that they possessed magical abilities. The North American Zuni tribe believed left-handedness signified good luck. I'm no unicorn, but I do sparkle.

Tests conducted by St. Lawrence University in New York found that there were more left-handed people with IQs over 140 than right-handed people.

Wedding rings are traditionally worn on the left hand because people believed that a vena amoris, or a "lover's vein," connected the 4th finger on this hand to the heart.

The brains of left-handers process emotions differently than those of right-handers and are more susceptible to negative emotions, such as anger.

This is a lot to digest, but like any minority, I'm just asking for respect. I just want to be treated like everyone else!

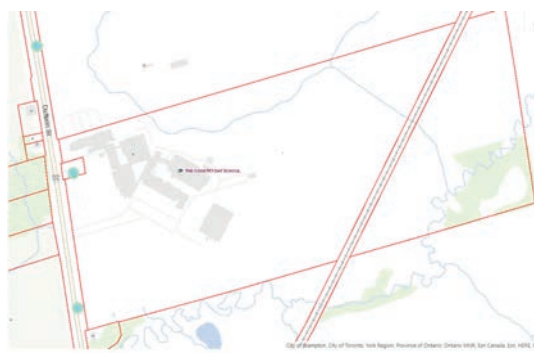

## The role of a tree bylaw

I strongly believe that trees play a vital role in contributing to healthy, attractive and resilient communities. A quote from the website of the Ontario Urban Forest Council says it well: "Urban trees do more than just clean our air. They are a vital player from a social & economic perspective as well."

I've always enjoyed and appreciated trees. However, over the past three years of learning about trees and their benefits, I've come to recognize that various initiatives play a significant role in conserving mature healthy trees and expanding the tree canopy - education and awareness, community tree-planting events, incentives to plant trees, and well-informed tree by-laws.

I see and applaud those who seek to manage trees responsibly on private property with the goal of conserving healthy trees, replacing trees removed and enriching biodiversity. At the same time, I'm observing many instances of the indiscriminate cutting of trees and forests in King, and I believe we need to find effective ways to address this. A by-law is one of the tools that can help.

The introduction of a private tree bylaw is often controversial. Toronto is going through growing pains as it seeks to protect its majestic mature trees and grow the tree canopy in the city, however, trees have certainly gained worthwhile attention and many left standing through the Toronto tree bylaw.

In an informative presentation I attended featuring Peter Wynnyczuk, executive director of the Ontario Urban Forest Council, Peter emphasized that

the primary goal of a private tree bylaw is to have a "conversation" with property owners. In effect, a permit process for removing trees causes people to pause and think. Could pruning address a concern or issue? Can a project be redesigned to incorporate mature healthy trees, or require less trees to be removed? We can all benefit from conversations and pausing to consider alternatives.

In the proposed King Private Tree by-law, I am supportive of the emphasis on replacement trees being required rather than permit fees when trees are removed. Yes, there are costs involved in planting replacement trees of a moderate size (2 to 3 inch diameter) on either private or municipal lands, however, this is vitally important for future generations and for the long-term health of our communities, a worthwhile investment.

I think there is some refining and improvements needed in the draft tree bylaw, but it has the clear foundation for an informed, future-oriented by-law that can lead to the conservation of mature healthy trees and the growing of the tree canopy in King's three main villages - King City, Nobleton and Schomberg.

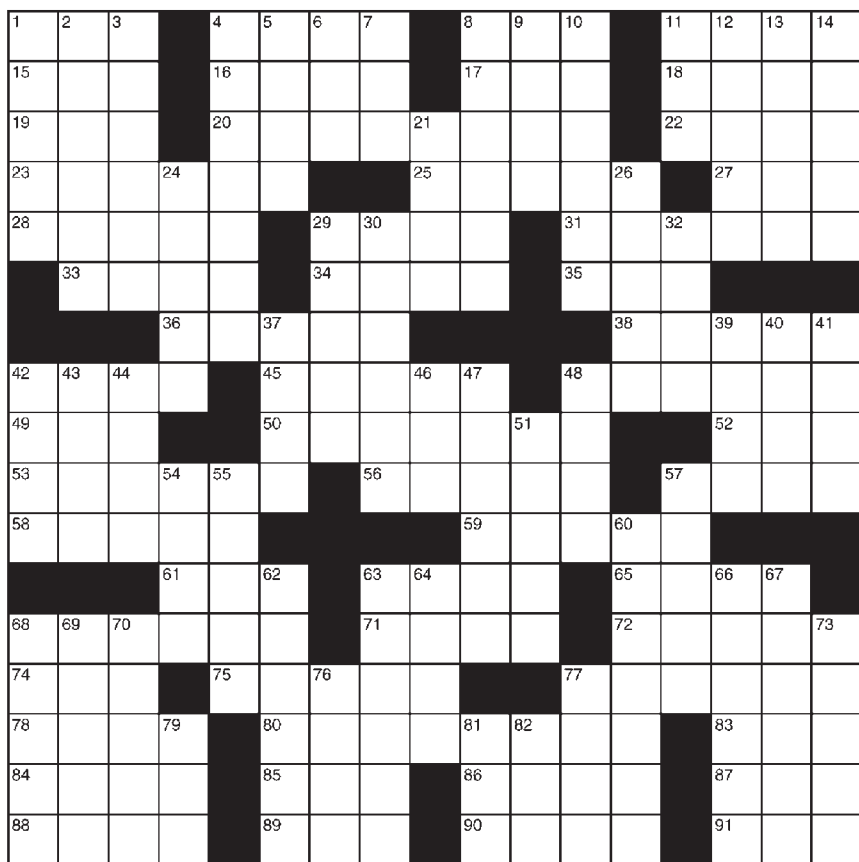

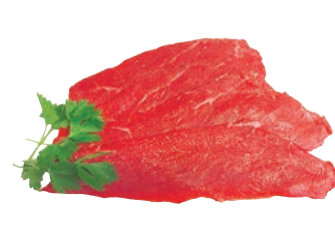

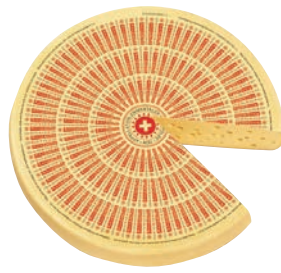

## Goals, strategies set stage for King budget

Setting their sights on the 2020 budget, King Township councillors and staff have some very defined goals and strategies to achieve them.

The biggest push is to limit tax increases, and through 2022, the Township is keeping the increase at no more than 2.9%

Their perennial emphasis is to maintain existing programs at current service levels. This coming year, staff will identify the incremental operating costs directly associated with growth in population and/or municipal service requirements. They hope to keep user fees in check, too, limiting hikes to 2.5%

Water and wastewater rate increases are tied to York Region's multi-year financial sustainability plan, as well as Township operating/capital requirements.

Last year's budget marked the first iteration of a multi-year budget format, that included expense forecasts through 2022. These projected hikes were pegged at between 2.6% and 2.75%.

King did approve tackling climate change through efficiencies and targets at the municipal level. While this may result in fiscal pressure into the coming budget cycle, there's no provision at this point to dedicate funds.

This year's budget also continues key priorities that include a comprehensive road improvement program.

Staff plan to present draft budgets and business plans in early December, with final adoption slated for January 2020.

Keeping the increase at under 3% will be a bit of a challenge. Some of the more significant strains will be salary increases of the collective bargaining agreement; winter road maintenance; tending to existing infrastructure and contributing to reserves. However, lessening the impact will be assessment growth and available grant money from senior levels of government.

"... the 2020-2022 budgets and business plans will establish commitment-based expenditures and associated sources of funding in support of the provision to provide municipal services in 2020 and beyond," staff noted. "Staff continue to utilize the ISCP (Integrated Community Sustainability Plan) to ensure financial sustainability is a key consideration in decision-making processes that can directly impact the future fiscal state of the Township."

## Local filmmaker honoured for his work

A young local filmmaker is well on his way to a strong career.

Schomberg's Nicholas Facchini, a film student at Ryerson, has been rewarded for a piece that was shot locally.

Facchini has been screening the film circuit and winning awards for the last few years. In the fall of 2018 he filmed a documentary which was filmed in part in Schomberg. A number of local children appeared in the film and the parents were 100% supportive.

His film was well received by Ryerson and was selected to screen at the Ryerson theatre. Recently, his film was selected to screen at the Toronto Youth Shorts Film Festival. He ended up winning two awards - Achievement in Film Direction for Non-fiction and the Industry Choice Award.

"Life In Bathrooms" was a project



he did for a third year film production course. He wanted to pitch and create a documentary that leaned towards his fiction sensibilities as much as possible.

The approach, he explained, was to make a recreational documentary; interviewing the subject about his personal stories and then creating visuals to accompany the narration.

"With this, I wanted the visuals to be as poetic and stripped as possible. The main goal of this project was to take the emotions of my subject's story and elevate them through any visually poetic means possible. When it comes to that, I think I was successful as the film has garnered very good reception."

The film features his best friend Evan, and seminal moments in his life that all happened around bathrooms.

Facchini based the project off photos, and interviewing Evan about three of the stories. The film captures and visually renders these moments in Evan's life that happened to him as a child, a teen and a young adult.

"The most fun part of the film was creating the visuals," he said, noting there were minimal set pieces. The actual bathroom scenes were shot on location.

One story was particularly interesting because it involved a moment with up to five elementary school boys goofing around. "There was a great energy

in set getting all these kids to just goof around and have a blast while making a movie at the same time," Facchini said. "It was the most hectic day but the energy kept it from being stressful."

Facchini was concept developer, director, co-producer and editor on the file. He also operated the camera for several shots.

The result, and response, has been great.

Through festivals, even more people have been enjoying it. At the Shorts festival he received a fantastic review from a critic. The film is still touring the festival circuit and in the coming year it will be available online. If anybody wants to keep up with where the film is screening they can follow his Instagram @n.facchini for any updates.

His short-term goals are to graduate this year, gradually work his way into the Kaye's industry and make films.

"I currently have two films I'm directing in the works so that's going great for now. As for long term, I hope to get my shorts in to bigger and bigger festivals, eventually making features and projects with enough notoriety that I could be creating my own work for a living. I think that's the dream."

Facchini loves the visual poetry of cinema, the way you can render any human emotion through elements of film.

"It's just sounds and light and yet people go to the movies and laugh and cry and scream. It's like the world's greatest magic show. Shaping visuals to tell stories with tone and points of interest is great. You can really feel a film, more so than a book. To me, cinema is more like music; it can really be felt by a viewer and you can see yourself in it."

The recent awards and recognition were incredible.

"It really shows how I've been able to grow as a filmmaker and let's me know I'm on the right path."

## Niagara University unveils Vaughan site

Niagara University formally unveiled its new location in Vaughan with a ribbon-cutting ceremony Monday morning.

The site, in the Vaughan Metropolitan Centre, is also the first-ever university to be established in the Vaughan and York region.

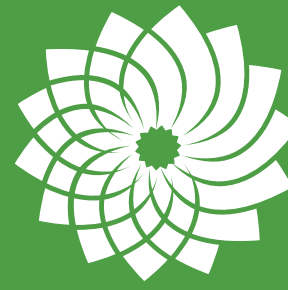
"We are pleased to continue to strengthen our binational relationship with the Province of Ontario by becoming a permanent part of the Vaughan community," said the Rev. James J. Maher, C.M., Niagara University president. "This new location will provide opportunities to better serve our students and faculty, while developing a learning environment that fosters research, teaching, and service to work with the community to make a positive impact on the lives of others."

Officials from Niagara University and the Province of Ontario cut the ribbon to officially unveil Niagara's permanent location in the city of Vaughan.

The nearly 12,000 square-foot site, located in the heart of Vaughan, includes seven classrooms, faculty and administration offices, and student lounge areas. Nine full-time faculty and administrators, as well as a number of part-time faculty and supervisors, staff that location, where more than 300 students are pursuing Bachelor of Professional Studies and Master of Science in Educational Leadership programs. In addition, approximately 50 practicing teachers take Additional Qualification course work each year.

The new location will give post-secondary students more choice on where to go to school, support the local economy and allow students to learn closer to home.

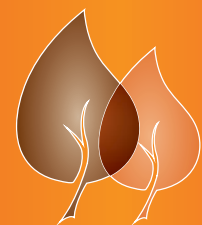

## King mayor, CAO join in on Tory's walking tour of Toronto

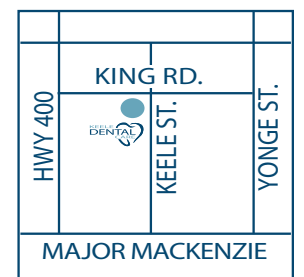

# Schomberg Cougars roar to fast start in PJHL season

The Schomberg Cougars are out to prove that last season's finish was an anomaly.

It was a four-point effort over the opening weekend of the Provincial Junior Hockey League season for the Junior C club, who posted wins over both the Huntsville Otters and Midland Flyers to take an early lead atop the Carruthers division.

Thursday's home opener against the Otters at Trisan Centre saw the Cougars take an early lead and never look back, with newcomer Vito Sica opening the scoring just past the five minute mark of the first period for his first goal in a Schomberg uniform.

The game did not go without its aggression, as season openers often do: Sica was handed down a five-game suspension from the league for his involvement in some late game antics,

earning a pair of misconducts.

Yet the Cougars kept rolling in their first road game of the season on Friday in visiting the Flyers in Midland, once again riding a 4-0 lead into an eventual win.

After a scoreless opening period, Matthew Wadge was the first on the board for the Cougars just over the mid-way point of the second, before Childerhose, Brandon Cohen, and Nicholas Vitale followed suit.

Nicolas Porretta took to the crease for the season's second game, holding onto the shutout until late in the third, before being beaten twice to finish with 24 saves over 26 total shots.

Calleja added a pair of his own late in the game to help Schomberg roll to a 6-2 victory.

It's a stellar start to the season for the cats, who last won a season opener in 2015, facing the Stayner Siskins when still playing in the Georgian Mid-Ontario Hockey League.

They two clubs are the only teams in the eight-team Carruthers division to open their season with a 2-0 record, though the Penetang Kings could still reach the mark after winning their first and only game.

The Cougars open up a four-game home stand on Thursday at Trisan Centre, hosting the Siskins in a battle of the undefeateds. Puck drop is set for 8:30 p.m.

They then have a week-long break before returning to their home rink to host the Alliston Hornets on Sept. 26.

## Hillis has named captain of Storm

York-Simcoe Express and St. Andrew's College alumni Cam Hillis has been chosen to weather the Storm through the 2019-20 OHL season.

The 19-year-old centre was recently handed the captaincy in what will be his third season with the Guelph Storm, the 29th to wear the 'C' on his chest for the hockey club.

"Cam's commitment to improve each day both on and off the ice, combined with his desire to lead and set the example within our community make him a most deserving choice to lead the Storm hockey club," said General Manager and Head Coach George Burnett in a press release.

Drafted in the third round, 66th overall in last June's NHL Entry Draft, Hillis' rise up the Canadiens' depth charts was meteoric in just his few months with the club: a gamble that has paid off since changing his path three years prior.

During the midpoint of the 2015-16 Express season, Hillis had committed to a scholarship at Providence College in the NCAA's top division, a common route these days for elite Canadian athletes.

It was after putting up an astonishing 72 points in just 33 games with the Minor Midget AAA Express that he put his academic goals on hold to follow his dream, going the traditional route in joining the Guelph Storm of the OHL.

A highly-successful following season with the St. Andrew's College Saints in Aurora, leading the varsity program in scoring, landed him a full-time role with the Storm.

Fifty-nine points in sixty games as a seventeen-year old was all Montreal needed to see to put a jersey on the 5'10" centreman, who then went on to add 22 points in an injury-shortened season last year, though his leadership both on the ice and in the room were enough to earn him the captaincy.

"Cam is the natural choice to lead our program moving forward," said Burnett. "Despite all of the adversity he faced, enduring and rehabbing from three major injuries during this past season, Cam contributed significantly to our leadership group and provided tremendous inspiration to our team throughout the season and playoff run."

Hillis added that it was "a huge honour" to be given the responsibility.

"There have been a lot of great leaders to pass through this organization and I'm thankful to now be a part of that history," said Hillis. "It has been a goal of mine since my early time in Guelph and I'm grateful to have been alongside many great leaders in the past."

"I'm looking forward to leading a young team and I have high expectations for our group next year."

Battling three different injuries in the 2018-19 season, plenty of the credit to Hillis' rehab can be given to his work in the offseason training at St. Andrew's College, under the tutelage of ex-NHLer Gary Roberts.

"It was a strange year...It came with a lot of frustration and I've worked hard to put myself in a position to move forward and be ready to go for the season."

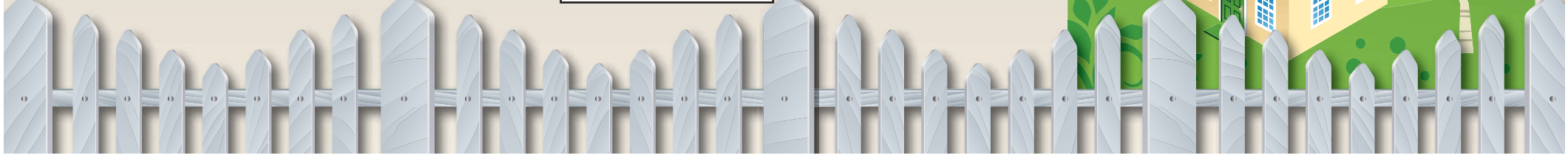
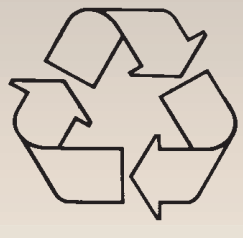
