Mayor reflects on milestones in 2024


As 2024 draws to a close, I'm delighted to reflect on a transformative year for King Township – a year marked by innovation, sustainability and a deep commitment to community well-being. Here are just some of the highlights of what we've accomplished together.

We're thrilled to announce the upcoming opening of the Zancor Centre in January. This state-of-the-art, multi-use recreation facility will be the first in Canada to achieve Zero Carbon Building Design certification. With two NHL-sized ice rinks, aquatics facilities and a turf fieldhouse, the Zancor Centre represents a milestone in sustainability and recreation. And note, less than 1% of the cost came from residential taxes; we received federal, provincial and developers' contributions to fund the cost.

Community-driven planning exercises are underway for King City and Nobleton, ensuring sustainable and vibrant development in key areas. Open houses welcomed residents to shape the vision for these neighborhoods, emphasizing heritage preservation and community growth. Stay tuned for a series of more Open Houses for the Official Plan review scheduled for January.

Feedback from residents and stakeholders is helping shape the long-term vision for our transportation infrastructure, ensuring King Township remains well-connected, accessible and future-ready.

This year, we harnessed technology to make King Township more efficient, transparent and accessible. We launched our performance dashboard, which allows residents to track service delivery metrics, from snow clearing to recreation programs, enhancing transpar-



ency and accountability. Kingsley, our Virtual Assistant, powered by AI, offers 24/7 assistance on our website, making it easier than ever for residents to access information.

Ask King Planning is a new online service which enables residents to schedule one-onone consultations with planners at their convenience, streamlining access to critical planning services.

We continued to prioritize community well-being and heritage preservation. Utilizing \$250,000 in provincial funding, we began restoring two iconic buildings – the King Christian Church and the King Railway Station – underscoring our dedication to preserving King's rich history.

September saw the launch of our first annual Safe Streets initiative, focusing on pedestrian, cyclist and driver safety.

We expanded the Taste of Main dining event from Schomberg to all of King Township, renaming it Taste of King. The two-week culinary celebration spotlights the Township's culinary diversity, from fine dining to casual bites, at eateries across the Township. We also introduced a new event, Kingtoberfest, which celebrated German culture and cuisine at the Cold Creek Conservation Area.

This year, we introduced a new service-based budget model, emphasizing transparency and alignment with community priorities as we continue to deliver high-quality services while responsibly managing taxpayer funds.

As we look to 2025, I'm excited for what's to come – the official opening of the Zancor Centre, further progress in neighborhood planning and ongoing community engagement in shaping our Township's future.

Thank you to our Council, staff, and most importantly, our residents and businesses for your partnership and support. Together, we're making King Township an exceptional place to live, work and thrive.

## King Chamber marks successes in 2024

The King Chamber of Commerce is on an upward trajectory.

And the past year marked many firsts, milestones and achievements. This past year, the Chamber welcomed five new board of directors - Sonja Golchin, David Magahey, Carmelinda Galota, Stephanie Sinclair and past-president Angelo Santorelli.

A new Chamber Ambassador Program was launched, where members pay for their logo to be feature in a pop-up banner and displayed prominently at out events. This brought in a dozen ambassadors.

The Township Coupon Booklet, containing 38 coupons, was launched.

In April, a special event – Ladies Who Lead – was held, through Seneca HELIX HERizons Program. The topic was "Knowing Your Worth in the Workplace" and the event attracted 60 attendees.

The annual Mayor's Luncheon in May drew more than 145 guests at Nobleton Lakes. Mayor Steve Pellegrini provided township updated, goals and accomplishments.

The event series, "King After Five," was launched, after the successful Rooftop Sunset Mingle in July. "King After Five" helps the business community connect and network. The next one is scheduled for Jan. 16, 2025 at Nobleton Dental Smiles - "New Year, New Smiles."

The launch of King Proud and the Morning Youth Grant was another huge milestone. In all, seven recipients were selected in the first intake, each receiving \$500 to kickstart/ enhance their business.

King Proud merchandise supports the grant. The second intake will take place this coming spring. Boosting the campaign were donations by the King City Lions (\$1,500) and Seneca College (\$2,500).

A new signature event rolled in, the Gran Fondo King (September). This new event, with the help of B1 Gruppo, attracted over 150 cyclists who were able to choose from two routes. Jerseys were made by local business Surge Activewear and featured the amazing sponsors.

In August, the Farm to Table event was once again held at Beretta Farms, with a farm fresh meal provided by Beretta. The event, meant to celebrate our local farmers, attracted 83 attendees and vendors.

The King Chamber wants to be unique from ever other chambers and that's why they are offering exclusive member perks - 30% all Cintas Services; travel savings (through Chloe the Travel Agent and Elena Cortesi wired for Travel); Mark's Commercial digital Savings Card (only chamber in Canada offering this perk).

The annual Excellence in Business Awards enjoyed a first – a sold-out crowd of 149. Seven awards and two new ones were handed out this year. The night also celebrated the Morning Youth Grant recipients and provided them plaques and gave an opportunity for them to address the crowd on their businesses and what the funds went towards.

Chamber representatives showed their community support at more than 50 events throughout the year.

The year also saw 14 new annual sponsors, and membership increased by almost 10% with 250+ members.

The Chamber now has an office located at the Trisan Centre and is staffed every Wednesday and Thursday, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mercedes Lato was hired as a full-time permanent employee of KCC as the Member Services Manager.

The Chamber is promising more successes and special events in 2025.

# MPP looks forward with 'hope' and 'optimism'

As we close out a strong year and look forward to 2025 with hope and optimism – I want to take a minute and highlight some of our community's greatest accomplishments this year.

Our government put forward an ambitious plan to improve our healthcare system and address the shortage of family doctors in our community. So, in addition to delivering the largest medical school expansion in decades - including by building net-new medical schools in the GTA - this past spring, we made history by delivering the York University School of Medicine, Canada's very first medical school with a dedicated mandate to train new family doctors that is set to open in 2028 at the Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital, just down Jane Street. This means it is now possible for a student raised in King to go to medical school in our community and stay here to serve local families across our cherished hamlets.

Our mission is simple: to deliver better healthcare, closer to home – and we will continue to do just that.

We are also building two brand new longterm care homes, one at St. Rita at Mary Lake and another at the Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital, to deliver a combined 416 net-new longterm care beds that will serve our seniors who have sacrificed so much to build this country.

Before 2018, King Township had the lowest ratio of long-term care beds to residents in the province. That was an unacceptable reality, and these new state-of-the-art facilities will ensure that is no longer the case by allowing our seniors to age in comfort close to their loved ones.

On the transit front, I've heard loud and clear from King City residents that we need to put an end to the loud horns of the GO train. I listened – and was proud to announce that we are literally getting rid of the bells and whistles at Station Rd, Dufferin St, and 15th Sideroad crossings – a big win for families living nearby. At the same time, we're upgrading the King City GO station with substantial renovations to make your commute faster and more convenient – like adding 198 net-new parking spaces, and delivering two-way, all-day train service by building a second platform and installing a second track.

This year, we've also integrated all GTA transit fares into "One Fare," saving you an average of \$1,600 every year by eliminating double fares when transferring from the GO train to the TTC or YRT.

Recently, I was proud to provide a positive progress update to our community on highspeed internet expansion to the rural households of our Township, with the YorkNet expansion project on track to connect over 3,800 homes in York Region to reliable, high-speed internet by the end of this year. If you live on a rural road in the Township and don't currently have access to high-speed internet – chances are, you will be connected very soon.

With that said, there is one item that I know is top of mind for everyone in the Township: affordability. And it's why we've stood up for the taxpayer at every turn. Whether it's taking the Provincial Sales Tax off essential items, removing the Gas Tax to save you 10.7 cents/litre at the pumps, standing up to the expensive Federal Liberal Carbon Tax that adds 17.6 cents/litre every time you refill your car, or keeping your Hydro rates low, we will continue investing in the critical infrastructure needed to grow our province and economy – without raising your taxes.


As we end 2024 on a positive note, stay tuned for much more to come soon. In just under a month from now, we will see the new Township-Wide Recreation Centre finally open its doors to King families. Growing up as a Hockey Kid, I know very well how important access to sports and recreation is to kids and families – so I made it a personal mission to deliver this state-of-the-art recreation centre equipped with two NHL-sized ice rinks, a six-lane 25-metre lap pool and an athletic fieldhouse. This was the largest provincial investment in any community or recreation centre in the history of our province.


A parting note – thank you for your continued support, but more importantly, thank you for strong advocacy on these issues that hit home for so many. I know that by working together, we can – and will – make our community better for our families, friends, and neighbours.

My New Year's resolution is to continue standing up for common sense values: Getting tough on crime. Keeping energy bills and taxes down. Opposing the Federal Liberal Carbon Tax. And building for the future. I'm wishing every one of you all the best as we kick-off the new year.
